The University of Kentucky Academic Scholarship Program offers funds to outstanding students who demonstrate the potential for superior academic performance. Scholarship awards are made without regard to race, creed, religious preferences, sex, or financial status.

Transfer students currently enrolled full-time at an accredited institution who will be transferring to the UK main campus for the 2010 fall semester may apply for academic scholarships. To be eligible, applicants must have completed a minimum of 24 semester hours and be enrolled full-time at an accredited institution for the Spring 2010 semester. A minimum 3.30 cumulative GPA is required.

Factors which are considered in the evaluation of scholarship applications include an essay, leadership experience, grades, extracurricular activities, work experience, awards and recognition, and community service.

Unfortunately, the University of Kentucky cannot offer scholarships to all of the excellent students who apply. However, we can assure each applicant that he or she will receive consideration and fair treatment in what is a very competitive situation.

Applicants for a Trustees Scholarship are required to submit the following to the Office of Academic Scholarships no later than MAY 14, 2010 :

- Completed Scholarship Application (this form)** bearing the student's signature and date of application.
- Official College Transcript** from all previous accredited institutions attended with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.30 on 4.00 scale (as calculated by the Office of Academic Scholarships). Students who do not meet the minimum GPA requirements cannot be considered for awards. Additionally, a final transcript is required upon completion of the Spring 2009 semester.
- Essay** of approximately 500 words on the following topic:
Please explain the most valuable lesson you have learned from a paid or volunteer position. How have you incorporated this lesson into your life?

Please note: IN ADDITION, applicants for an academic scholarship must submit a completed University of Kentucky Admission Application to the UK Office of Undergraduate Admission prior to May 14th in order to be considered for an academic scholarship.

Scholarship Application Process Timeline


May 14, 2010 – All students must have submitted applications.
June 30, 2010 – All students will be notified of their status by mail.
July 15, 2010 – All students must have accepted awards.

TRUSTEES SCHOLARSHIPS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

 Currently enrolled KCTCS students that will earn their Associate's in Arts or Associate's in Science Degree with a 3.50 cumulative GPA after the spring 2010 term and then transfer to UK for the fall 2010 term are eligible to compete for a limited number of two year renewable awards which cover the difference between UK tuition and KCTCS tuition. A final transcript must be submitted along with this application documenting spring 2010 grades and the awarding of an Associate's in Arts or Associate's in Science Degree.

 Currently enrolled KCTCS students with 48 hours after the spring 2010 semester (with at least 24 earned at KCTCS) and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.30, that are not receiving the above award, are eligible to compete for a limited number of \$4,000 scholarships, payable as \$2,000 per year for up to two years.

 All other transfer students with a minimum 3.30 cumulative GPA, that are currently enrolled at an accredited institution and will have 24 hours by the end of the Spring 2010 term, are eligible to compete for a limited number of \$1,500 non-renewable awards.

NOTE: Several departments and colleges within the University administer their own scholarship program. Students who have chosen a major are encouraged to contact the department or college in their major area of study regarding scholarship opportunities.

Students currently applying to or enrolled on the Medical Center Campus (Colleges of Health Sciences, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Dentistry, and Public Health) are not eligible for these scholarships and should contact their respective departments for scholarship information.

Renewal of all academic scholarships is contingent upon full-time UK enrollment on the main campus with a cumulative grade point average of 3.30 or better at UK. For two-year awards, failure to meet these stipulations will result in one semester of scholarship probation. Students who drop a course may be liable for the expenses incurred. Scholarship money credited to the payment of dropped courses may be removed and the student may be billed for any costs incurred if the course is dropped after the deadline for receiving a full refund.

PLEASE NOTE: This application, official transcripts from accredited institutions, and your essay must be received in the Office of Academic Scholarships or postmarked by May 14, 2010. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.
