SECURITY: CREDIT CARD USE

At the February UK IT Security Working Group (Community of Practice), a presentation by Kevin Sisler (Kevin.Sisler@uky.edu) indicated the following items for credit card use:

- Credit cards entered through standard web sites ([HTTP://](http://)) are insecure. If a standard UK web site requests this information, notify Kevin Sisler.
- Credit cards need to be processed through an external vendor.
- If credit card information needs to be transmitted to UK for payments, Kevin Sisler should be contacted to review compliance on receipt of payments.
- Do not accept credit card payments via email. If someone sends credit card payment information via email, it was indicated to send a reply email indicating payments need to be processed by another means.
- No mobile payments for UK should be accepted via cell phones (example: iPhone Square). These devices haven't been cleared for UK use to transmit this type of information.
- No credit card information should be sent over the UK wireless network. UK wireless networks haven't been designated as safe for transfer of this type of sensitive information.
- Documents on computers with unneeded credit card numbers should be removed asap.

SECURITY: ADBOE FLASH PLAYER UPDATE

Adobe has released security updates for Windows Adobe Flash Player 11.6.602.168/earlier, and Mac Adobe Flash player 11.2.202.270/earlier. The vulnerabilities could allow a computer to crash, and allow an attacker to control the system. More information is available at the following location:

SECURITY: SECURITY ADVISORY FOR ADOBE ACROBAT READER & ACROBAT

Critical vulnerabilities have been identified in Acrobat Reader and Adobe Acrobat XI, X, 9.5.3 and earlier versions for Windows and Mac. Reported vulnerabilities could cause Adobe Acrobat to crash and allow an attacker to control the computer. These vulnerabilities are being used by attackers attempting to trick users to open a PDF file via email.

A workaround for Adobe Reader XI and Acrobat XI is to enable Protected View, by the following in Acrobat:

1. Edit > Preferences > Security (Enhanced)
2. Checkmark "Enable Enhanced Security"
3. Select "Files from potentially unsafe locations" and click OK.

SECURITY: HOAX - FED-EX EMAIL HOAX

A hoax Fed Ex email with the subject "Tracking Detail", is circulating that requests the user click a link to "Get & Print Receipt". **DELETE THE FORWARDED EMAIL IMMEDIATELY**, if received. This is a hoax email with the following indications of it being a hoax:

1. The From address is "@cincinnati.com", instead of a FedEx email address.
2. The hoax is reported at <http://www.hoax-slayer.com/fake-fedex-invoice-malware.shtml>

Email links and attachments can infect computers with malware or viruses. Send suspicious unsolicited emails to kveach@uky.edu. Recipients can also contact a company directly (don't reply to the email) to verify authenticity of emails. If you have received this email and clicked the link, contact kveach@uky.edu to check your computer for malware or viruses.

SECURITY: HOAX WARNING – 1 NEW MESSAGE

A new hoax email is being sent to the department, with the From address indicating "University of Kentucky - Webmail Service". DO NOT CLICK THE LINK in the document, and delete the forwarded email immediately if received. Indications of the forwarded email being a hoax are the following:

1. The From address isn't UK affiliated (@rsu.edu).
2. A UK person would be indicated in UK email to contact for assistance.
3. The link isn't a UK link address (www.semazen.net).
4. Email messages would be sent to your email mailbox, instead of having to click a link.

SECURITY: SPEARPHISHING

Spearphishing tricks targeted individuals (email appearing relevant to a person) into divulging information that can be used to infiltrate an organization, and aimed at intelligence gathering. Malicious files or links are used in Spearphishing, and can be sent in an email that appears to be legitimate, but once the file is opened (typically a malicious PDF or use of Google Docs), passwords can be captured or hackers can control your computer. 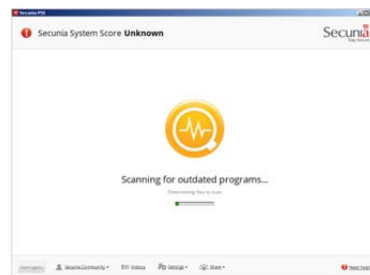
SECURITY: FREE SECURITY APPLICATIONS

Free applications that can help to protect your computer from malware, spyware, hijackers, and other malicious programs, include the following:

- **Spybot** – Features a immunize feature to protect automatically from malicious software entering the computer. Manual Spybot scans need to be performed to detect intrusions, periodically, that Spybot doesn't immunize against.

- **Malwarebytes** – Manual scanning of computers, with a good detection/removal rate.

- **Sophos Rootkit Removal Tool** – Rootkits are installed to hide themselves from the operating system and many antivirus programs. The Sophos Rootkit Removal Tool can work with your existing antivirus program to detect/remove rootkits from your computer.

MULTI-STATE INFORMATION SHARING WORKSHOP

A Multi-State Information Sharing & Analysis Center workshop entitled “Cyber Security: Emerging Trends & Threats for 2013” was held in February on security threats including the following:

- **Ransomware**- Hackers controlling computers or files, and request payment to release control of the file or computer.
- **IP Lookup** – Attackers use your IP address to create believable scenarios related to your location, in an effort to obtain information or money. An example of this can be a fraudulent pop-up that indicates your location (city, state) or even your name.
- **Exploit Kits availability on the rise** – Kits to find weaknesses in computer and network defenses to deploy malware. These can come from malicious websites. Information that can be

transmitted include operating system versions, browsers used/installed, etc. Known exploits, including zero day exploits (known problems with no fix) can be used to insert malicious code on a system. Links and downloads can be used to place malicious files on a computer.

 - Apply operating system

 - Update antivirus/spyware (ex. Forefront EndPoint, and Spybot) removal software
 - Spybot update – Start > Programs > Spybot > Update Spybot
 - Spybot Immunize – Start > Programs > Spybot Search & Destroy > Spybot > Immunize Button > +Immunize button
 - Scan your computer for viruses/malware
 - Run Spybot scan – Start > Programs > Spybot Search & Destroy > Spybot > Check for Problems button.
 - Run a Forefront EndPoint antivirus scan – Start > Programs > Microsoft Forefront EndPoint Protection > choose quick or full (better but longer) scan > Scan Now button
 - Be cautious of browser/email links and downloads.
 - Be suspicious of unsolicited emails requesting personal information.
