Dr. Beth Johnson is a Field Veterinarian with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture's State Veterinarian Office. She is also a member of both the American Association of Small Ruminant Practitioners and the Kentucky Goat Producers.

Tom Keene, is an Agronomy Specialist with the University of Kentucky working with forages and hemp production in Eastern Kentucky and Statewide.

Dr. Chris Teutsch is the Forage Extension Specialist at the UK Research and Education Center at Princeton. He has won numerous awards for his work with the forage and livestock industry, including the American Forage and Grassland Council's Medallion Award.

David graduated from UK with Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Agriculture Economics.
