The School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences at Auburn University is seeking candidates for the position of Research Fellow. The individual in this position will work on a land use modeling project, which looks into the impact of market, public policy, urbanization on forest/agricultural land use change in the southern U.S. and collaborate with others on various projects such as trade modeling and foreign direct investment in forest industry.
