

Assistant Professor, Forest Operations and Harvesting, Clemson University

The Department of Forestry and Natural Resources, Clemson University, invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in the area of forest operations and harvesting. This is a 9-month position at the rank of Assistant Professor with a research (50%) and teaching (50%) appointment.

Position Description: Teaching responsibilities include undergraduate courses in harvesting of forest products and wood procurement practices as well as development of a graduate-level course in the incumbent's area of expertise. The incumbent will be expected to develop an extramurally funded research program in the specialized field of forest operations, including harvesting. Research areas of emphasis may include, but are not limited to, operations research applications in forestry, business applications in forestry, forest investments, and forest harvesting systems. Service responsibilities include interactions with constituents as well as participation in university and professional communities.

Qualifications: Ph.D. in forest operations/harvesting or closely related field with an emphasis in forest management or economics. At least one degree, preferably the baccalaureate, must be from a Society of American Foresters' accredited forestry program. Professional record of publication and teaching experience preferred. Industry or agency experience desired.

Closing Date: The search committee will begin screening of applications August 15, 2005. The search will continue until a suitable candidate is identified with a projected hire date no later than January 1, 2006.
