### FOREST TECHNOLOGY FACULTY POSITION

**GENERAL:** Glenville State College is seeking applications for a 9-month teaching position in Forest Technology, an associate degree program offered with the Division of Arts and Sciences. The successful candidate will have primary responsibility for teaching and advising in the program. The salary is competitive, but will be based on education and experience.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** M.S. in Forest Resources (Ph.D. preferred). Occupational experience in forest technology and prior teaching experience at the post-secondary level desired. Education and/or experience in the area of land surveying, natural resources, or environmental science a plus.

#### DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Teach 12 hours of courses in forest technology per semester. Courses are dependent on qualifications and background, but will most likely include dendrology, wood products, timber harvesting, forest management, and aerial photography.
- Evaluate and revise curriculum and courses for the forest technology associate degree program.
- Develop and implement professional development activities for persons employed in the field of forestry.
- Assist with student recruitment.
- Work closely with business, industry and government agencies in meeting their workforce development needs.
- Work closely with the West Virginia Forestry Association and the Society of American Foresters.
- Assist in writing grant proposals as needed.
- Assist and help oversee the division computer laboratory.
- Other duties as needed.
