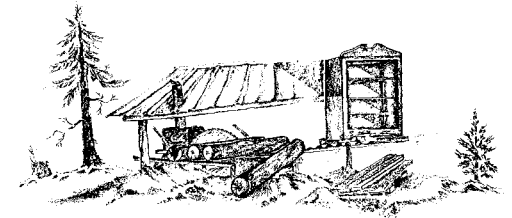

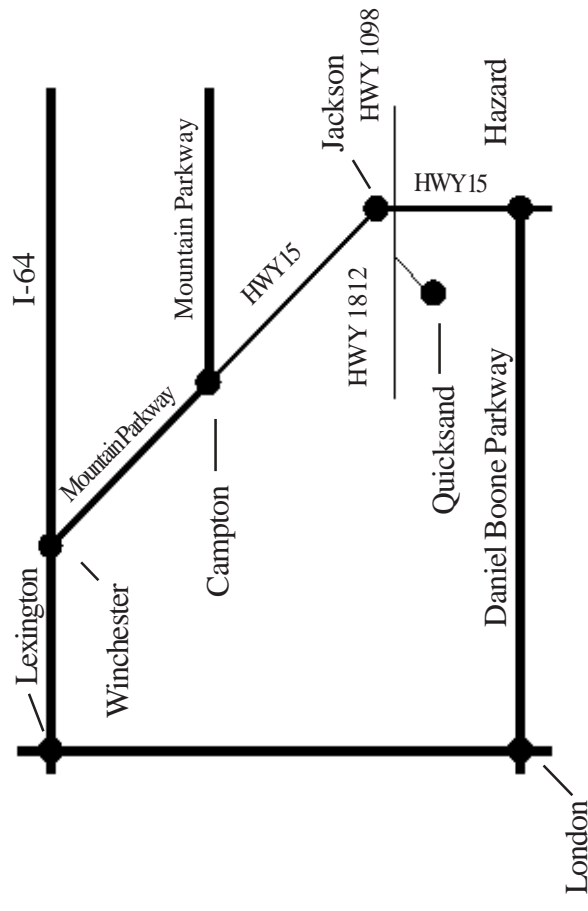

- 1 I-64 to Mountain Parkway
- 2 Mountain Parkway to Exit 43
- 3 Highway 15 South to HWY 1812 West (One Mile Past Jackson)

- 5 Immediate left onto Robinson Road
- 6 Over Blue Bridge, follow signs to The Wood Utilization Center

Program:

The annual Win With Wood - Forestry and Woodworking Competition will be held in May 2002. The event, hosted by Hazard Community College Forest and Wood Technology Program and the University of Kentucky Wood Utilization Center, is the only opportunity for high school juniors and seniors to compete individually in both forestry and woodworking events.

Any high school junior and senior is eligible to compete. Home school students or students at a school that is not planning to attend this year's event, feel free to contact us for more information about how to enter the competition.

This year, we have more scholarships for the winners in each category than in the past, and are used when the student enters the Forest and Wood Technology Program.

Competitions:**Tree Identification:**

Students will demonstrate their ability to identify trees in eastern Kentucky. Ten trees will be marked for the students to identify.

Equipment Identification:

Students will demonstrate their ability to identify tools used in forestry. Twenty items will be on display for students to identify.

Compass and Pacing:

Students will use a compass to measure the azimuth of ten lines to the nearest degree and then measure the distance from point to point by pacing. Each student will supply his/her compass.

Timber Cruising:

Students will demonstrate their knowledge of timber cruising using plot sampling. Biltmore stick, tape measures and volume tables will be provided.

Tool Identification:

Students will demonstrate their ability to identify tools used in woodworking, as well as their function. Twenty items will be on display for participants to identify.

Wood Identification:

Students will demonstrate their ability to identify various woods used in woodworking.

Drafting Challenge:

Students will demonstrate their skill and knowledge of drafting terms and concepts.

Custom Woodworking Project:

Participants will demonstrate their ability design and produce an item made of wood. This item is to be completed and must arrive for judging one week prior to the event.

Mass Produced Woodworking Project:

Students will demonstrate their ability to design and mass produce an item made of wood. This item is to be completed and sent for judging one week prior to the event.
