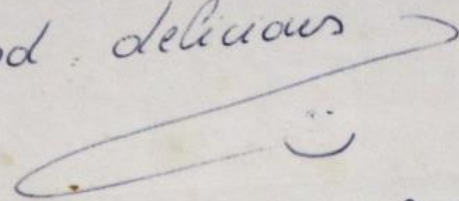

The orange fruits are loquats and the green fruits are fresh almonds.

The interesting green herb to the right is a Prussian wild asparagus.



Prussian wild asparagus is
Ornithogalum pyrenaicum.
It grows wild in Europe and
the young stems are harvested
and eaten like asparagus.



Next to our Paris hotel was a small north African market with unusual fruits and vegetables used in African and Indian cooking.



Bitter Kola nut
(*Garcinia kola*) is
used in traditional
African medicine.



Kola nuts (*Cola*) is an African native plant with a caffeine containing seed used to flavor beverages.

It is the original flavor used to create cola drinks.



Bitter melon (*Momordica charantia*) is a bitter flavored fruit in the cucumber family used in traditional Asian dishes.



Spiny gourd
(*Momordica dioica*)
is related to bitter
melon and used in
traditional Indian
cuisine.



Pointed gourd
(*Trichosanthes dioica*)
is another member of
the cucumber family
used in Indian cooking.
