Remarkably, it was not too hard for David to call ahead and get an alternative meal.














The evenings activity was to take a water taxi to Santa Cruz La Laguna. Unfortunately, rain was a very good possibility.

Maximon is a deity looked after by a local support group – the Confradia of Santa Cruz.


Maximon is a statue, but unfortunately for us, he was resting when we came to visit.




Then the rains came. Someone help that poor tuc-tuc.



Next morning it cleared and the lake slowly came to life.




