The KVS will have an optional Celebration of Kentucky Wines featuring Kentucky wines prior to the banquet. Dr. Jimmy Henning, U.K. Director of Cooperative Extension, will speak on the College of Agriculture Vision for the Future and we will relax to the tunes of the U.K. Jazz Cats at the banquet. This year the KVS will host a special Vintners' Dinner on the evening of January 8th.

We will have a Trading Post bulletin board to sell used equipment. If you are looking for equipment buyers, bring along a description containing your name, phone number and the equipment price.

PLEASE make your room reservations directly with the hotel. Our block of rooms will be held until Dec. 15, 2007. Be sure to let the hotel know that you will be staying for the Kentucky Fruit and Vegetable Growers Conference to obtain our special suite room rate (they are all suites) of \$99.00. 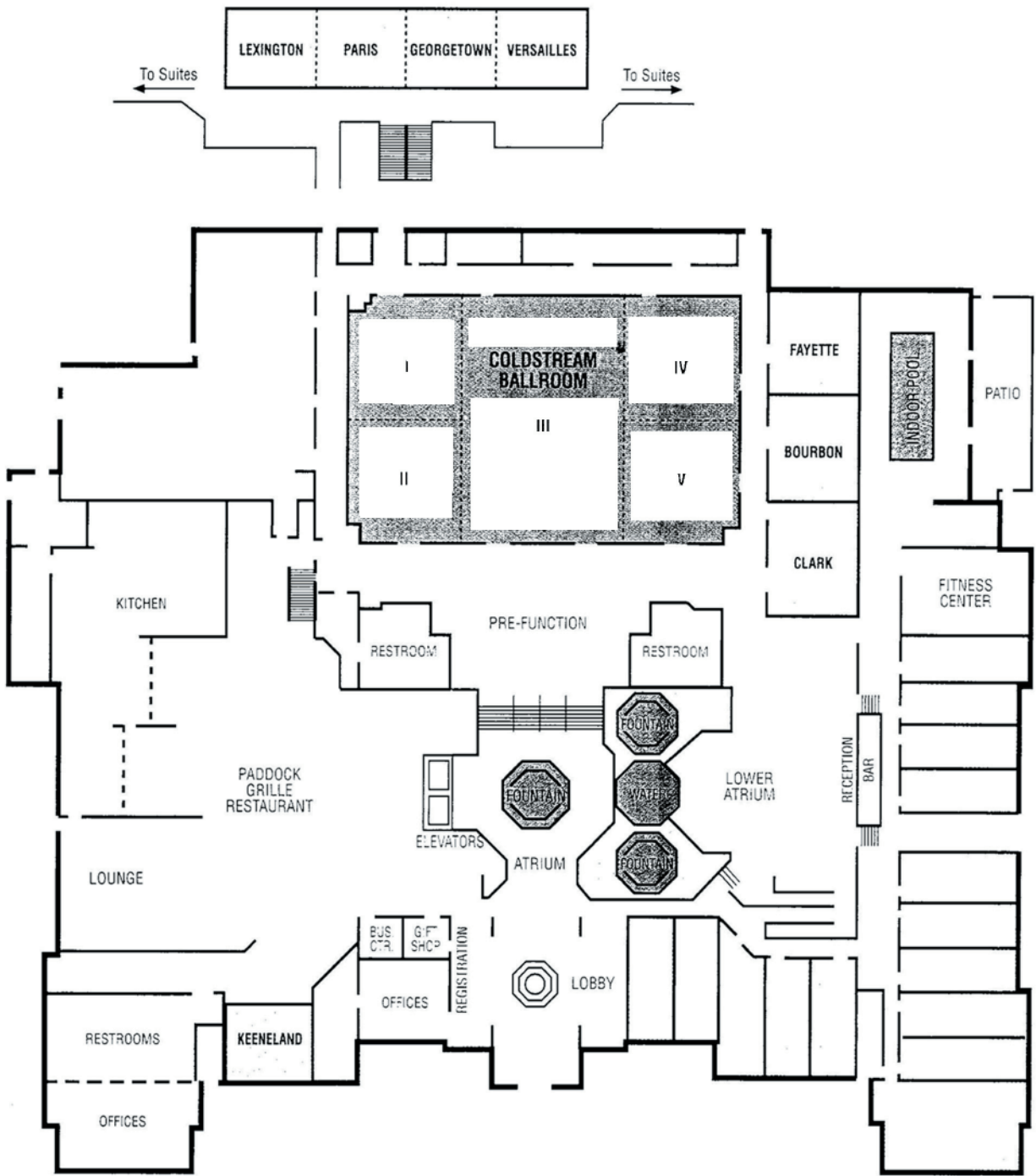
