The Kentucky Agricultural Leadership Program (KALP) is an intensive 18 month program designed for young agricultural and agribusiness professionals from Kentucky who want to be on the “cutting edge” of decisions that affect agriculture, rural communities and society in the 21st century. The program consists of bringing in national speakers to address important/timely agricultural issues, and to improve participant’s communication, leadership, and management skills so that they can enhance Kentucky agriculture and our rural communities.

The program consists of ten domestic seminars, including trips to Frankfort, Washington D.C, and Kentucky agribusinesses. A 5-7 day tour to visit agriculture in another state, along with a 10-14 day international trip, are also included in the program. Kentucky based seminars will be conducted at various locations across the state. Educational (non-travel) seminars generally will be 2-3 days in duration. Seminars generally occur once a month in January, February, March, July, October, November, and December. The international trip will be in January 2011. In total participants will spend more than 50 days in seminars and travel over the 18 month period.
