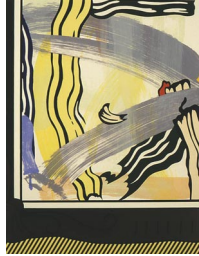


Contemporary American Art Timeline



1905
Tiffany Pond Lily Lamp
KY 1904-Law is passed making it illegal to integrate schools.



1923
Lichtenstein, Painting in Gold Frame
KY 1927-Strikes occur and battles break out over conditions in mines.



1931
Davis, Barber Shop Chord
KY 1930-devastating drought across the state.



1935
Cothingham, Carl's from Cothingham Suite
KY 1936-Dams are built on Kentucky rivers to comply with a Federal Flood Control Act

Wood, Seed and Harvest
KY 1937-The Daniel Boone National Forest is opened.



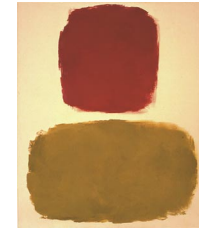
1945

KY 1960-Loretta Lynn has her first performance at the Grand Ole Opry.



1965
Barnhart, Mine Textures
KY 1966-Ky strip-mine laws are passed to protect destroyed lands.

U.S. 1905-Wright pilots the first successful plane flight.

U.S. 1914-1918-World War I, 1920-Women's right to vote, 1920's-Economic prosperity encouraging growth of the middle class.

U.S. 1928-Flemming discovers penicillin, 1929-Crash of the Stock Market.

U.S. 1935-Dust Bowl continues forcing thousands of farmers to abandon their land.

U.S. 1933-FDR's New Deal, implementing government programs to encourage economic development after the war. Murals covered walls in public places depicting job development. 1939-Commercial television begins.

U.S. 1941-World War II begins with the attack on Pearl Harbor, FDR is president. 1945-FDR dies, Truman succeeds, two Atomic bombs are dropped on Japan.

U.S. 1954-Brown v. Board of Education, beginning the modern Civil Rights Movement, outlawing segregation. 1955- Salk invents Polio vaccine.

U.S. 1950's-regained economic prosperity. It was the "golden age of the teenager," highlighting Elvis and a television set in most homes. 1955-Rosa Parks holds her seat on the bus.

U.S. 1960-JFK elected president, 1962-Development of the Peace Corp, 1963-Kennedy assassinated.

U.S. 1963-Martin Luther King's "I have a Dream" speech, 1964-Civil Rights Act.

U.S. 1965-Repeal of the discriminatory immigration laws from the 1920's, 1965-Voting Rights Act, African Americans can vote, 1965-Ground troops are sent to Vietnam.

KY 1974-Cave Run Lake is created. A series of deadly tornados passes through the state. 1978-The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) bans aerosol products that damage the ozone.

KY 1981-The endangered Osprey is released at Land Between the Lakes and continues to reproduce.



1982

KY 1981-General Motors opens the Corvette plant in Boling Green.



1982
Bolotin, Harper and Bernice
KY 1983-Martha Lane Collins is elected as the first female governor.



1984
Longo, Cindy, from Men in the City Series
KY 1986-Toyota opens its automobile plant in Georgetown.



1984
Christo, Lower Manhattan Wrapped Building
KY 1988-Establishment of the Lottery in Kentucky.



1989
Cochron, Fly Away
Kentucky's number one cash crop remains tobacco. The Kentucky Education Reform Act (K.E.R.A. is passed)



1991
Clark, Untitled
KY 1991-Seven Bald Eagles are born in Kentucky. 1992-Kentucky celebrates its bicentennial.

U.S. 1965-Repeal of the discriminatory immigration laws from the 1920's, 1965-Voting Rights Act, African Americans can vote, 1965-Ground troops sent to Vietnam.

U.S. 1967-Anti-war rallies of Vietnam War, 1968-Nixon elected president, 1969-Neil Armstrong set foot on the moon, 1970-1st Earth Day.

U.S. 1974-Nixon resigns over Watergate, 1976-The Apple I computer is introduced.

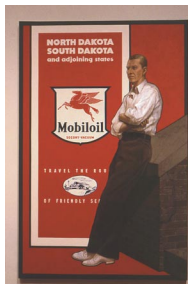
U.S. 1979-American Embassy employees hold hostages for 444 days in Iran, 1981-Mtv, the music television aired.

U.S. 1982-Bill Gates and Microsoft became household names as personal computers entered households. 1982-Right to Know Act is passed after deadly toxins are released at a Union Carbide plant in India.

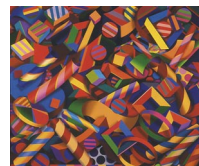
U.S. 1983-Iran-Contra Affair, during Reagan's presidency, American hostages were held after weapons were illegally sold to Iran, government officials denied involvement in the scandal.

U.S. 1989-The Exxon Valdez oil spill. 1990-Hubble Space Telescope sent into space. 1990- The AIDS virus reached epidemic proportions.

U.S. 1991-A recyclable vinyl bottle is developed. 1991-The Cold War ends and the Berlin Wall is torn down. Operation Desert Storm begins the Gulf War.

KY 1993-“Trail of Tears” Commemorative Park opens in Hopkinsville.



2000
Corbin, The Saga and the Journey of the Ant Bully #2
KY 1997-Tubby Smith becomes the University of Kentucky’s first African-American head basketball coach.



2002
Butterfield, EastWest
KY 1999-The largest coal slurry spill in occurs in Eastern Kentucky.

U.S. 1992-Rodney King riots, resulting in more than 50 deaths and thousands of buildings damaged over economic discrimination and police abuse.

U.S. 2000-The Presidential Election between Al Gore and George Bush, Sr. resulted in a Supreme Court ruling to decide who would be the President.

U.S. 2001-September 11th, planes crash into the World Trade Center and the Pentagon.
