Please indicate the following information in a separate document (cover letter or email message): Type of presentation: state your preference - **oral/poster** presentation (the abstract will be considered for an oral presentation and you will be notified if selected by April 21st, 2003), or **poster only** presentation; and choose a session for your presentation: **The World of Isoprenoids, Novel Systems and New Insights, Biochemical and Molecular Dissection, Nutritional and Industrial Applications, Advances with New Technologies**

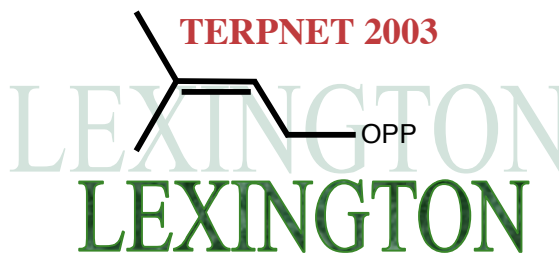
