To register your procurement card for UPS shipments please complete the bottom of this form and return it via fax to 1-972-884-3083. This will ensure that you receive the special UK discounted rates when you use your procurement card.

After registering your card number with UPS (please allow 2 weeks), for manual processing of air or international shipments, simply select the Bill Shipper option in section 7 (method of payment) on the Shipping Document. Another method for processing air, ground and international shipments is the Online processing of shipments can be processed by visiting www.ups.com. This site can be used for ground, air and international shipments. If using the Internet, please select "Bill UPS Account Number" as the method of payment. Do not include your procurement card account number. This account number has been setup to automatically charge this account. Call UPS to request an "ON-CALL AIR PICKUP @ 1-800-742-5877 or deposit your shipment in one of your many Drop-Boxes located all across campus. You can also drop your shipments off at the UK post office in the basement of the classroom building.
