Academic Excellence Scholarships

available to
UNDERGRADUATE, PART-TIME STUDENTS, AGES 25 AND OVER

■ SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS:

Scholarships of **\$1,000 each** will be awarded while funding is available during the 2009-2010 academic year as: 1) \$500 will reimburse tuition for 2010 Spring semester, 2) \$500 will reimburse tuition for the 2010 First Summer session, while eligibility is maintained.

■ ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Applicants must be part-time, undergraduate students, ages 25 and over who are currently enrolled in classes scheduled on the Lexington Campus.
- Applicants are required to have a cumulative UK GPA of 3.25 or better by February 10, 2010 and maintain a cumulative UK GPA of 3.25 or better while receiving this award.*
- Candidates must have accumulated at least a total of 12 semester hours at UK (total credit hours may be a **combination** of Lexington Campus credits and credits earned at Bluegrass Community and Technical College).
- Applicants are required to be enrolled between 6 to 11 hours during the 2010 Spring semester and between 2 to 3 hours during the 2010 First Summer Session or 3 to 5 hours in the 2010 Second Summer Session.
- Candidates must not be receiving other 2009-2010 scholarships from the Merit Scholarship Office.
- Applicants are required to take all courses for a letter grade (unless course is offered Pass/Fail only).

*If you are a readmitted UK student with a 3.25 GPA since readmission, you meet all other requirements for this scholarship, but your previous GPA makes you ineligible, you may be a candidate for the University's academic bankruptcy rule. See the 2009-2010 UK Bulletin.

■ DEADLINE:

LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED. Completed applications must be received in room 13A Funkhouser Building, **before 6:00 P.M., Wednesday, February 10, 2010**. An application form is on the back.

■ SELECTION PROCESS:

The Academic Excellence Scholarship is a competition in which applications will be evaluated and ranked by committee members. Members will consider the applicant's: 1) UK cumulative GPA; 2) academic merit and potential; 3) essay, in terms of content and style; and 4) outside activities, including employment. A portion of the score will be based on committee discretion. Awards will be made starting with the highest ranking student and going down the list until all available funds are exhausted. **The decisions of the selection committee are final.**
