COURSE TITLE: Field Experiences in Secondary Education

CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Field experience with Middle and High School students in programs of sports, physical education, health education, and recreation.

Prereq: KHP 360 and/or 253 equivalent experience or consent of field director.

OBJECTIVES:

1. The students will become familiar with middle and senior high school activities used in school a setting. **Educational Opportunities**: The student will become familiar with the middle and senior high school activities by visiting schools. **Assessment**: Students will record activity involvement during school setting.
2. The students shall observe middle or senior high school students in physical education and health settings. **Educational Opportunities**: The students will have an opportunity to see and participate in activities that will help them become aware of levels of abilities in this age group. **Assessment**: The students will write a summary of activities for each field experience.
3. The students will implement plans for physical education activities for middle and senior high school settings. **Educational Opportunities**: Students will become familiar with daily plans and activities for teaching middle or high school students. **Assessment**: The students will be accountable for attending four (4) different school sites to accumulate the required hours.

4. The students must attend class on all designated dates. **Educational Opportunities:** Students will have an opportunity to discuss situations that occur during their field experience and talk with their peers about their experiences. **Assessment:** Points or hours will be deducted from experience for not attending discussions. Verbal feedback will be provided by the instructor.
5. Students will e-mail their progress reports on designated dates to Dr. Taylor. **Educational Opportunities:** Students will have an opportunity to use today's technology in the e-mail system. **Assessment:** The students must report on hours they observed for the period and on their total hours. Verbal feedback will be provided by the instructor.
6. Students will keep totals of all times observed. **Educational Opportunities:** The student will have an opportunity to learn how to discipline themselves in reporting their field experience hours to Dr. Taylor at specified times. **Assessment:** The students will have a total of sixty (60) hours--thirty (30) hours in middle or senior high school physical education, and thirty (30) hours in middle or high school health education. Verbal feedback will be provided by the instructor.

DEFINITION OF FIELD EXPERIENCE

Field experiences are activities in which students can serve a useful or functional role as a volunteer helper or assistant. The work usually involves contact with middle and senior high school age students. Such involvement often is geared to allow the student some responsibility.

Credit will not be given in this course for those experiences in which other credit is received. In other words, you can not "double dip." For example, you can not use hours if you are observing a school for KHP 344.

EVALUATION

A point system is used to equate the amount and intensity of the field experience. Students may earn no more than thirty (30) points for one experience. A single point may be earned for each 1-2 hours participation, depending upon the experience. This judgement is made by the advisor. Thirty (30) hours approximates the time require for one semester hour laboratory course in physical education and thirty (30) hours in health education. While point accumulation is a help, it is not the only measure for evaluation. The quality, the nature, the variety in selection, the extent, and the ability represented in the written reports are all considerations.

Written Report--There will be a written report on the summary of your field experience from the various schools or recreational settings. The report will be approximately 4-5 pages explaining about your experiences and future actions you might choose once you are in the professional field.

Important:

1. Class will meet on the assigned dates: There will be a penalty for not reporting progress: Five (5) points will be deducted from the field experience total hours.
2. The students will e-mail their progress every two (2) weeks on designated dates to Dr. Taylor. Five (5) points will be deducted from total field experience hours each time students fail to report progress.
3. By September 6, students should have designated placement for schools or recreation settings. A list of sites should be turned in to Dr. Taylor. Three (3) points will be deducted each day that the list is late.
4. By October 18, students should have half of the required sixty (60) total hours. Penalty: Five (5) points will be deducted from field experience hours. *If you are doing both 361 and 362, you must have half in each course.
5. You must have at least four (4) different sites. Penalty: Five (5) points will be deducted from field experience hours FOR failure to do so.

GRADE RANGES:

30-44 Hours = C

45-59 Hours = B

60 or more points = A

*After completion of an experience, a written report of four to five (4-5) pages must be submitted to receive credit for the experience.
