Important Information for Orff Schulwerk Teacher Training Participants

Workshop Registration

Please register for the workshop from 8:00 to 8:20 am, Monday, in the lobby of the Singletary Center for the Arts, (Corner of Euclid and Rose Street; please enter from Patterson Drive). Please be on time in order to complete workshop enrollment, as the sessions will start promptly at 8:20. Lunch is from 12 noon to 1 pm, and sessions will end at 4:30 pm. A Graduate School official is available to meet with students wanting assistance for university admission and course credit registration during lunch on the first day.

FEES: Pay at least \$225 or pay in full on Day 1 of the workshop. The remaining balance must be paid by October 1, 2009. You may pay by cash, credit card, personal check or school check payable to “the University of Kentucky”. An envelope will be provided for your payment. If your school is paying for you, we must have a purchase order by Day 1 of the workshop.

Sessions will take place in the Singletary Center for the Arts, the Lucille Little Fine Arts Library, and the Fine Arts Building.

Parking

Parking is no longer free at most UK parking lots. If you are staying at the university dormitory, you can park there for free. Otherwise, you either park on the streets nearby, or purchase a parking permit for \$12 for two weeks. With the purchased permit, you may park your car at the **R12** on Linden Walk or other R lots. There are several R lots on Linden Walk behind Rose Street across from the Fine Arts Building. Avoid spaces marked by yellow, yellow-and-white, green-and-white, yellow-and-black, blue, or with handicapped signs. Due to campus renovation, Greg Page apartments are no longer available. Instead, Ingles Hall, one of the newer dormitories will be used for our participants. **Ingles Hall** (#567 on the campus map) is at Woodland Drive and University Drive, about ten minutes walk to the Fine Arts Building. The rent per person per night is \$16 for double occupancy, or \$20 for single occupancy. Linens can be rented for \$5 per night. These rooms are suites with a bathroom between two units.

University Credits

For Kentucky residents:

Level One --MUS 561-020 (2 credits)

Level Two --MUS 561-021 (2 credits)

Level Three—Music 561-022 (2 credits)

If you wish more credit hours, add *MUS 560-220 for one or two additional credits. Extra written assignments are to be expected and submitted by August 1.

For residents outside of Kentucky:

*MUS 560-220—Orff Schulwerk (2-3 credits).

*MUS 666-220—Advanced Orff Schulwerk (1-3 credits)

*NOTE: MUS 560-220 or MUS 666-220 is listed as a Distance Learning Course. Participants must submit their work by the Computer via the Blackboard courseware on completion of their work. When you enroll in MUS 560-220, your name will be added to this Blackboard course. You will be asked to log on and sign in. You can learn to do it by going to the Blackboard page (<http://elearning.uky.edu>), or let us walk you through it during the workshop.

You need to be admitted to the University of Kentucky in order to register for credits. You may apply for admission or re-admission online. To apply for admission online, visit <http://www.gradschool.uky.edu/>.

These credits are applicable towards the **UK Graduate Orff-Schulwerk Certificate** that is a twelve-hour curriculum in Orff Schulwerk at UK. For more information, visit <http://www.uky.edu/~cecilia/Orff/OrffGradCert.htm>

These credits are also applicable towards the [Master Degree](#) in Music Education or [Rank I program in Music Education](#).

After you are admitted to the University, the Graduate School will give you instruction to register for classes by telephone (VIP) or via the Internet. It would be best to have this procedure completed early. However, if you miss the regular UK registration date, we would be happy to help you register on the first day of the class. To register as a Post-baccalaureate Non-Degree status, we will need a single copy of the transcript that shows your completion of a Bachelor Degree with a 2.5 GPA or above. **Please bring a copy with you.**

Up to nine hours of Non-degree Post-Baccalaureate credits may be transferred to a UK degree program later on. Admissions to a Graduate Degree program require GRE scores, a music Entrance Exam, a resume, and three reference letters. Certification Requirements

To obtain level certification, students must attend all sessions, participate fully and complete all competencies for each level. In addition, students who sign up for additional graduate credits will complete additional written assignments (article reports, lessons plans, or composition, depending on the Level, to be completed by August 1). To obtain certification,

no one should have an absence of more than three hours. If you foresee a problem with attendance, please notify your instructor as soon as possible.

Things to Bring

Bring song, recorder, and poetry books, recorders of all sizes, manuscript paper, pencil, pen, & a ruler. A laptop and a small bar instrument (optional) might be helpful for completing assignments. Computers are available in the Fine Arts Library for your use. Ethernet and wireless Internet access is available at all libraries and dormitories on campus.

Course Notes will be given in a flash drive early in the course. No hard copy will be provided.

Bring a three-ring binder (required, minimum 1-1/2 " to 2" thick) to organize your notes. Wear comfortable clothing and shoes suitable for movement. Bring a light jacket for air-conditioned rooms.

West Music is also running a bookstore providing you with books required for the Course as well as reference materials, recorders and supplies during the two-week Orff Course. In addition, the University

Bookstore has a large selection of books and supplies. If you have special needs for materials or billing, call West Music ahead of time to send the materials to avoid shipping charge.
