<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College Profile Report 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Jayna asked if the college code could be added to the report in addition to the college name. The college code is the first 2 characters of the Department. 	<p>In SIS there are many Departments within a College. In FRS/HRS there are many Departments within a College and College is designated by the first 2 digits of the Department Number.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The degree/major combination is unique to one college. ▪ CIP codes can have multiple degree/majors. ▪ In A&S, each major has 2 degree codes, BA and BS. The major/degree code is unique, the CIP code is not. ▪ For Agriculture Engineering 140301, the BA Degree belongs to Engineering, the MA Degree belongs to Agriculture, and the PhD Degree belongs to Agriculture. All have the same CIP code. ▪ Multiple SIS Major codes map to the same CIP code. ▪ Economics 450601 maps to BA in A&S, an MA in B&E, and a PhD in B&E.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Jayna said if all the elements are in SIS we should be able to automate the reports for the data mart. ▪ The CIP code cannot be mapped to the Course Prefix because every Course Prefix does not have a specific major. A course can apply to multiple majors. The Course Prefix is usually attached to the Department. ▪ Units within a department want to be able to report on their own Course Prefixes and information about their own Majors.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ ACTION 10/4/02: Ruby will modify his report and add a column for the 5-character Department Number to match FRS/HRS.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Ruby suggested adding a start and stop date to terms and FRS Department Numbers. An alternative is to take snapshots of the data 1 time each semester. ▪ The SIS Major does not change, but who it belongs to can. ▪ Is a table needed containing two Department Numbers, one (FRS/HRS) to use when reporting on faculty and another (SIS) to use when reporting on students? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ ACTION ITEM 10/4/02: A cross-reference table containing two Department Numbers, one (FRS/HRS) to use when reporting on faculty, and another (SIS) to use when reporting on students is needed.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Another issue is for colleges which used to be one unit, such as Agriculture and Engineering. These were divided and engineering is not offered out of agriculture now. Half the courses are owned by Engineering and the other half are owned by Agriculture.
