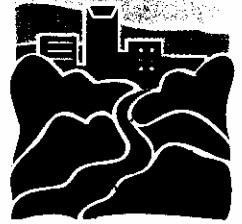

2004 KRA watershed grant – final report Project Completion Report

Project update

Since our interim report the Town Branch Trail, Inc. Board of Directors has taken a step back from what we described in our interim report and approached the project with the intention to make it larger and more comprehensive in scope. Although this report constitutes a final report for the 2004 grant, it will only be a milestone for us on the way to what will require considerably more work and funding. For this reason we do not have a finished product. Instead, what we have is a well-crafted outline, narrative, and script for a three-part education package directed specifically at the KERA approved curriculum for the public middle school classroom. This document is meant to be the guide for the production of the educational materials. The final product will consist of a three-lesson set of videos, handouts, and online materials.

In order to fulfill this larger scope, Town Branch Trail, Inc. hired Lonnie Harp, an education writer and consultant to help us produce the specific plan and script for the educational material. Our central objective has been to make the environmental education material pertinent to the Town Branch Creek and Watershed and to fashion the lessons in a way that would dovetail into the required public school curriculum as effectively as possible. With a number of meetings, emails and revisions, Town Branch Trail, Inc. and Lonnie Harp were able to collaborate with various public school teachers and education authorities to produce the attached document.

Please accept our wholehearted thanks for your generous support. We look forward to raising the funds necessary to initiate the production and distribution of this exciting project.
