The Patterson School is a highly ranked, selective 18-month masters degree program in diplomacy and international commerce at the University of Kentucky in Lexington.

The school occupies a particularly unique niche. It is one of smallest ranked international studies programs, admitting each year only 35 new students (all resident and full-time). This ensures an exceptional level of attention, instruction and interaction. This intimate learning environment is coupled with a surprisingly flexible curriculum, enabling each student to develop a highly personal path of study. At the same time, all students are exposed to both diplomacy and commerce, including site visits to headquarters, manufacturing or operating facilities of several leading multinational corporations. Finally, the school is an exceptional value, providing a world-class education at a decidedly low cost.

Mission:

The Patterson School serves the state, nation and world by the rigorous education of future leaders to work in international diplomacy, commerce, development, intelligence, and security. This is accomplished in a flexible, intimate learning environment that integrates academic studies, practical training, and real world experience to prepare exceptional students for careers with global responsibilities in the public, private and non-profit sectors.

History:

Founded in 1959, the Patterson School has focused from the beginning on providing graduate education to students in the areas of diplomacy and international commerce. This was the vision of James Kennedy Patterson, the first president of the University of Kentucky, who provided the trust that established the school. Patterson School's directors have included Amry Vandenbosch, Vince Davis, John Stempel, Michael Desch and Carey Cavanaugh.
