

THIS IS LEXINGTON!

Instructions

Welcome to Lexington! This game is designed to offer information for new students and allow them to have fun while learning about their new home. This game can be used during a full class period or half of one.

- Divide students into three or four teams and have them select team captains.
- The team captain will be responsible for conferring with team members and submitting answers throughout the game.
- Distribute handouts to each student in the class. Game categories correspond with sections on the handout. Students are allowed to use the handout to formulate a response.
- The game is played like the television version of “Jeopardy!” You will find a game board and answers/questions included in the lesson plan. You can turn the game board into a transparency for an overhead projector, or you can recreate it on a blackboard or a poster.
- Select one of the teams to choose first. They will select a category and an answer, which will then be open to all teams. Whichever team “buzzes in” first has an opportunity to respond. Their response should be in the form of a question. If they respond incorrectly, the other teams can then buzz in. Whichever team responds correctly gains control of the board and can choose the next answer.
- Each correct response earns the assigned number of points for the team that got it right—or subtracts the assigned number of points for any team that got it wrong.
- For **DAILY DOUBLE** answers, only the team that selected it has an opportunity to respond. They must first decide how many points to wager. If they are right, they earn that many points. If they are wrong, they lose that many. If they have 0-500 points, they can risk up to 500.
- Keep track of each team’s score on the blackboard.
- At the beginning of the second round, the team with the fewest points selects first.
- At the end of the second round, allow the teams time to decide their wagers for the final question. The team captains must write their team’s wager on a slip of paper and turn it in to you.
- Once the Final Jeopardy answer is given, the teams will have 60 seconds to come up with the correct question—which must be submitted to you in writing.

- Read each team's response out loud to the class and then add or subtract the amount of their wager to their score based on whether their response was correct.
- In the end, the team with the highest score is the winner.

- \$1000 – A. You've hit the bull's eye if you know that this store is located on Nicholasville Road and also at Hamburg Pavilion.
Q. What is Target?

Find it at UK:

DAILY DOUBLE

- \$200 – A. In this building, named after a former UK President, students can gather for concerts, exhibits, lectures, and other performances.
Q. What is the Singletary Center for the Arts?
- \$400 – A. If a student wanted to buy stamps, send mail, or get a free mailbox without leaving campus, they could go here.
Q. Where is the UK Post Office (basement of the classroom building)?
- \$600 – A. You can get help with your papers, make copies, find a book, and enjoy a spicy beef wrap in this building.
Q. What is the W.T. Young Library?
- \$800 – A. Free checking accounts are available to students at the UK Federal Credit Union, located here.
Q. Where is the Student Center (2nd floor)? [another possible answer is Export St.]
- \$1000- A. Students can climb the wall and visit the Alcohol and Health Education Programming Office in this facility.
Q. What is the Johnson Recreation Center?

Heart of the City:

- \$200 – A. This park is unique to Kentucky and offers a light display during the holiday season.
Q. What is the Kentucky Horse Park?
- \$400 – A. During the fall and spring, many people attend horse races here.
Q. What is Keeneland?
- \$600 – A. This park, located right downtown, boasts fountains that light up at night.
Q. What is Triangle Park?
- \$800 – A. This historical site is the family home of a former U.S. First Lady.
Q. What is the Mary Todd Lincoln House?
- \$1000- A. As far as we know, there are no phantoms haunting this downtown arts center.
Q. What is the Lexington Opera House?

Hit the Road:

- \$200 – A. This office issues campus parking permits.
Q. What is UK Parking?
- \$400 – A. This is a regional facility that provides transportation to people from all over Kentucky.
Q. What is the Lexington/Bluegrass Airport?
- \$600 – A. This facility is located on New Circle Road and can be used to travel to other parts of the state or country.
Q. What is the Greyhound bus terminal?
- \$800 – A. The last four digits in the phone number of the local cab service spell this word.
Q. What is TAXI?
- \$1000 – A. This facility is located on Vine St. and can be used to travel within the city of Lexington.
Q. What is the Lextran bus transit center?

Play it Safe:

- \$200 – A. This office, located in Frazee Hall, provides free counseling and learning Skill services to all UK students.
Q. What is the Counseling and Testing Center?
- \$400 – A. This department is one of the largest law enforcement agencies in the state of Kentucky.
Q. What is the University of Kentucky Police Department?
- \$600 – A. This University publication states that weapons on campus are prohibited.
Q. What is *Student Rights and Responsibilities*?
- \$800 – A. This safety escort service is available for students from 8:30 p.m. to 1:30 a.m.
Q. What is SAFECATS?
- \$1000 – A. To make an appointment at University Health Services, dial a phone number with these last four digits, which spell an abbreviation for this word.
Q. What is appointment (APPT)?

- A. At least two campus buildings and one campus street are named after this man, the first president of the University of Kentucky.
