Midterm Grades...

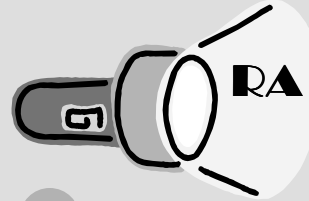
Midterm grades were reported on Monday, October 15 to each student's myUK account (100-500 level courses). This is a good time to calculate your midterm GPA. First year students have until Friday, November 9th to withdraw from the University or reduce course load *upon approval* from their advisor. Students can withdraw or reduce course load after this date only for "urgent non-academic reasons".

Grades are assigned a numerical value (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and E=0) which is multiplied by the number of credit hours of the course to calculate a quality point. Your grade point average is calculated by adding the number of quality points and dividing it by the number of quality hours taken that semester. Courses like UK 101 that are pass/fail do NOT factor into your GPA. Also, MA 108R does not factor into your "quality hours" only non-remedial letter grades courses. You could be taking 16 hours but your GPA may only be based on the outcome of 12 quality hours of letter-graded course work.

Knowing your grades at midterm can be a warning to change your behavior for the remainder of the semester and a great opportunity to meet with your instructor to determine what grades actually comprise your midterm grade. It's never too late to ask for help from your instructor, your advisor, and connect with other resources on campus.

Resources:

- The Study (257-1356) offers free peer tutoring in 100 level courses in the 3rd floor of the Commons on south campus Monday-Thursday from 3-10 p.m. and Sundays from 6-10 p.m.
- The Mathskeller (257-6108) is a computing and mathematics learning center that provides free tutoring for 100-level math courses in the CB 63 (basement of Whitehall Classroom Building) Monday-Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Center for Academic Resources and Enrichment Services (CARES: 323-6347) provides tutoring for underrepresented groups at 660 South Limestone Street. Student Support Services (257-9797) provides tutoring and academic support for first-generation college students, low income students, and students with a documented disability at 6 Alumni Gym.
- The Lab for Economic and Accounting Proficiency (LEAP) provides free tutoring for students enrolled in ACC 201, ACC 202, ECO 201 and ECO 202. The student run lab is located in Room 114 in the Business Information Center in the Gatton College of Business and Economics Building.
- Academic departments also offer pay-by-the hour tutors by appointment. Check with the department where help is needed. Your advisor can also provide an updated list of tutoring services at UK.
- Ask your RA if study groups have been formed in your residence hall. This is a great way to find other people living in your building who are taking the same classes as you! Organize a group study night and prepare for upcoming exams!

UK CLASS REGISTRATION 101!!!

- **PRIORITY REGISTRATION:** October 29, 2007 — November 20, 2007 (check to see when your 3-day window opens)
- **Add/Drop Windows:** November 27, 2007 — January 15, 2008

It's that time again! It is time to start setting your class schedule for Spring 2008. Remember that registering for classes is now done through your myUK account (unless otherwise specified by your college). For step-by-step instructions to register on myUK go to the following website:

Check to see if you are required to have a meeting with your academic advisor before you are able to register for classes. Connecting with your academic advisor can be very helpful if you need to ask questions and to ensure you are on the right track. Look ahead to the other courses you will need to take in the future and find out if some are only offered one time per year. For example, if you are required by your major to take a certain class and that course is only offered in the Spring, consider taking it next semester. Sometimes these classes fill up fast since they are limited in availability. Best of luck with registering and remember... don't be afraid to ask for help!
