SAFETY NET!

If you weren't one of the lucky residents who received a totally cool dry-erase board and other goodies from your Safety Net team, you might be asking yourself "So what's with all those Safety Net posters in the halls with people's pictures on them?" Well here's the skinny on Safety Net:

What is Safety Net?

Safety Net teams are assigned to each of the 21 Residence Halls on campus, and are comprised of trained staff and students who work together to facilitate a hall climate that is safe for all students and supportive of victims of violence. By building long-term relationships with hall residents over the course of a year, the Safety Net program hopes to move beyond one-time programming, toward the creation of a culture of increased trust, increased visibility of safety as a

key issue, and increased likelihood that victims of violence feel supported enough to report violent crimes and/or seek help and services. (Look for Safety Net posters in [North Hall!](#))

The Need:

Freshman year is a high risk time for sexual assault for incoming female students. Education and awareness of violence against women and other forms of violence on our campus is crucial. Over 90% of the incoming students at UK live in the Residence Halls. It is imperative that there is a highly visible presence of individuals who are identified as safe and approachable.

Purpose:

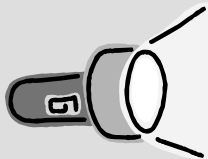
By facilitating relationships between residents and Safety Net team members, the program aims to increase help-seeking behaviors and reporting.

Who is Safety Net?

Safety Net is comprised of each hall's

Hall Director, dedicated RAs, students, UK staff, UKPD, and Bluegrass Rape Crisis Center staff. They can be easily identified by wearing their Safety Net t-shirts as couple hours a week while they are hanging out in the hall, as well as by seeing their picture on large Safety Net posters displayed in various places throughout each hall.

Safety Net has hit the ground running this year as it has been incorporated into many halls' programs. Students have already sought out their Safety Net team members to receive help and services for their specific needs. So take the time to thank your Safety Net for doing such amazing work to keep this campus safer for its students. Safety Net is sponsored in partnerships with UKPD, RSA, Res Life, Student Government, and the VIP Center.

Academic Enhancement in *The STUDY*



If you're not already aware of the services offered to students by **Academic Enhancement in The Study**, stop by our location on the 3rd floor of the Complex Commons building (right above Commons Market) in order to take advantage of our peer tutoring and academic consultation services (both of which are free) as well as our Study Smarter Seminars.

Peer tutoring in a wide variety of subjects is offered every Sunday from 6-10 pm as well as Monday through Thursday 3 -10 pm. Math and chemistry tutors are always available. A full schedule for tutoring and the subjects available can be found at our website www.uky.edu/UGS/study/. There's no need to call ahead or make an appointment—just bring your homework and your student ID to sign in. Peer Tutors have provided more than 2000 tutoring sessions since the first week of class. The atmosphere is laid-back and friendly, and you're welcome to use our space to study even if you don't need assistance.

Academic consultations enable you to meet one-on-one with a learning specialist to discuss effective study strategies based on your individual academic strengths and weaknesses. Follow-up sessions are available and are encouraged. Unlike tutoring, consultations do require an appointment (at least 24 hours in

advance), and can be scheduled through our website www.uky.edu/UGS/study/. Look for the link under "Announcements" on the home page.

Study Smarter seminars are intensive, non-credit earning classes offered in several evening sessions each semester. The total cost is \$25, which includes a formal learning assessment, four hours of instruction, and all course materials, which students may keep and use as a resource throughout the semester. Topics may include time management, note taking, critical reading, memory enhancement, exam preparation, and more.

Finally, ask your RA about our (free) casual peer presentations conveniently offered right in your own residence hall. Topics correspond to the academic calendar (such as exam prep around mid-terms) and will be presented monthly throughout the fall and spring semesters.
