

BCTC – UK Pathway to Transfer Sheet
Associate of Science for Biology

Suggested Course Sequence for Smooth Transfer

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy both the requirements for an Associate of Science degree at BCTC as well as the USP requirements for the University of Kentucky and the pre-major requirements for the Bachelor's degree in Biology.

Biology is a major in the College of Arts and Sciences, and therefore the requirements for the College of Arts and Sciences must be fulfilled to complete the Bachelor's degree. One of the A&S requirements is that students complete the fourth college semester of a single foreign language, or if the student had 2 years of a foreign language in high school, they could complete the third college semester of a second foreign language. The suggested curriculum would satisfy the College of Arts & Sciences foreign language requirement.

The suggested curriculum below totals 65 credit hours in order to complete the College of Arts & Sciences foreign language requirement. The University of Kentucky will accept up to 67 hours of transfer work from 2-year institutions, so all 65 hours of this curriculum would transfer to UK. However, only 60 credit hours are required for the Associate of Science degree.
