Tom Eblen is the metro/state columnist for the *Lex*ington Herald-Leader, the role for which he is best known by most Lexington residents. His creative interests are broader, however, and include writing contributions for magazines like Yes! (http:// www.yesmagazine.org/) and scholarly works like Bluegrass Renaissance: The History and Culture of Central Kentucky, 1792-1852 (J. C. Klotter and D. Rowland, eds., U. Press of KY), writing a blog (http:// www.tomeblen.com/blog/), and photography (http:// www.tomeblen.com/photography/). He was the Herald-Leader's managing editor from 1998 to 2008. Tom returned to his hometown in 1998 after 14 years with the Atlanta Journal-Constitution where he was a regional/ national reporter, a business reporter and editor, and an Olympics reporter and editor. Before that he spent five years at The Associated Press where he was a statehouse reporter in Nashville and correspondent in charge of the Knoxville bureau. Tom is a former board member of Associated Press Managing Editors. A graduate of Western Kentucky University, he was editor of the College Heights Herald. Tom has taught journalism ethics at U.K. and has been a frequent writing/editing coach at The Mountain Workshops. He and his wife Becky have two grown daughters, Mollie and Shannon. 

ELDER-LINK MENTORSHIP INITIATIVE

Graham D. Rowles, Graduate Center for Gerontology, spoke briefly at the Feb. 10, 2015 UKAEF luncheon describing the Elder-Link Mentorship Program that is currently under development. He encouraged UKAEF members to participate. Gerontology is currently offering an introductory course, "Growing Old in Today's World", to over 300 students in three sections. This course is part of a larger effort to increase students' contacts with seniors in order for them to experience meaningful relationships with older adults. Such relationships can take on a variety of forms intended to give students first-hand experiences of what older people are really like. The initiative will involve a network/database of interested students and older adults. It will provide extensive safeguards for access and privacy and the level and timing of commitment will be determined by each senior involved.
