



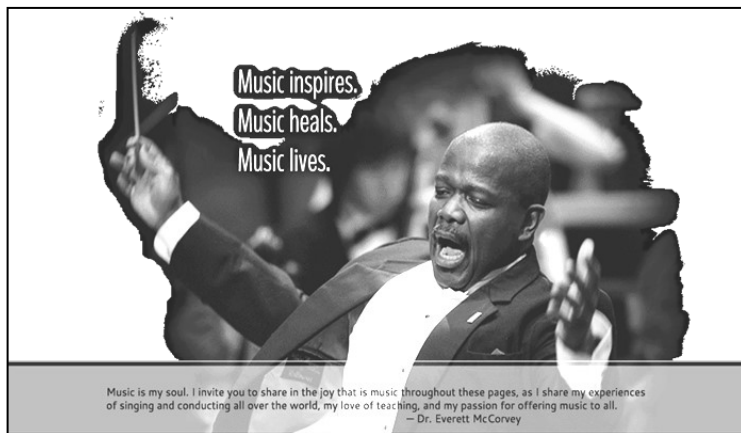

UKAEF FELLOWSHIP ENDOWMENT REPORT

Since UKAEF just awarded this year's fellowships, so generously supported by its members, it is appropriate to bring the members up-to-date on the endowment.

4. Does the Endowment provide sufficient funds for 3 fellowships at \$2500?

- It does not at present. UKAEF has provided \$5,445 total in four of the last five years to make up the difference between what is generated by the endowment and the \$7500 needed. UKAEF should not need to provide additional money this year or in the next couple of years because of residual dollars in the Fellowship Expenditure Account.
- The UKAEF Board has established an Endowment Contingency account of \$7500 over the last several years to cover any dire situation that may arise due to bad markets.
- All funds given for the fellowships are used for the endowment or for payment of the fellowships. Any UKAEF fund balances also go for that purpose.
- UK Development has a relatively complex spending distribution policy that insures fairness and returns 3-6% of the current endowment market value to the endowment to provide for cost of living increase.

5. How much does it cost for UK Development to manage the endowment fund?

The total management fees for 2005-2018 were \$9,937.

6. How much money has been generated by the endowment?

If the Market Value (\$213,461) is added to the fellowship awards since 2005 (\$84,000) plus the management fees (9,937), the result is \$307,398—that is, \$121,315 more than the Contributed Value.

KENTUCKY CELEBRATION

30TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION--HISTORY

Taking time to celebrate visionaries like Jean Pival (English), Paul Oberst (Law), Fannie Miller (Education), Don Ivy (Music), and Roberta James (UK Council on Aging) - the committee who first studied starting an association for UK retirees in 1987 - is appropriate. Here we are 30 years later as members of UKAEF, grateful for our independent association that keeps us involved professionally and socially and still connected to UK where we were faculty members. The first UKAEF meeting was held September 1988 using a format similar to what we do today: four meetings annually connected to luncheons with speakers and business meetings. One member involved in UKAEF leadership from its earliest days is Robert Stroup who served attentively on the Benefits Committee. Bob has faithfully represented the rights and privileges of retirees to the university-wide Employee Benefits Committee and he continues to assist Michael Tearney in this role.

Additional Historical highlights:

- 1994, Jean Pival, Fred Whiteside and Sydney Ulmer obtained non-profit status;
- 1995, Paul Oberst and Michael Adelstein led the initiative for UKAEF to offer fellowships for doctoral students who desire to teach at the university level;
- 2002, William Wagner and Juan Hernandez started an endowed fund of \$50,000 with the UK Office of Development. The Commonwealth of Kentucky Research Challenge Trust Fund (Bucks for Brains) matched their gifts. The Graduate School agreed to administer the \$100,000 endowment with input from UKAEF members.
- 1996-2019, UKAEF awarded 71 graduate students with fellowships from \$1,000 to \$2,500 for a total of
