ROBERT F. RUMPKE, Chair/CEO of Bluegrass Tomorrow

Rob Rumpke is a 40-year marketing and association management veteran who is currently the President/CEO of Bluegrass Tomorrow, an 18-county regional planning organization that focuses on partnership, collaboration and quality of life innovations. He

works to make the Bluegrass Region a better place to live and work. He has been with Bluegrass Tomorrow for 13 years.

A Lexington resident for 35 years, Rumpke spent 15 years working in Franklin, Madison and Woodford Counties, spent nine years with the Richmond Chamber of Commerce, and two years with the Woodford Chamber working on local and regional partnership and strategic planning projects through his consulting company RRA Inc. He has also been a partner with Rainmaker Advertising and has served on numerous boards, including chair of the Bluegrass Workforce Investment Board for the Bluegrass Area Development District for six years.

Rumpke is a Cincinnati native who, after graduating from the University of Dayton in 1980, went to work in the publicity department at the Cincinnati Reds. He also worked at the Public Information Office at Wittenberg University before moving to Lexington to work for Host Communications and the National Tour Association in 1986.

Rumpke worked in the horse industry for The Red Mile and its owners, the Lexington Trots Breeders Association, and Castleton Farm in the early 90s. From 1994 to 1999, he was President/CEO of the Kentucky Tourism Industry Council and was a tourism industry lobbyist. As a private consultant, he was also responsible for the development of the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame and the Richmond Battlefield Park.

Rumpke's wife Linda is a Vice President at Columbia Gas/Nisource. Linda was also a banking executive for over 30 years, and was president of two different banks. They have two sons: Michael 35 (married to Kassie, and granddaughter Aniston), and Marc 20, who is currently a sophomore and football player at the University of Dayton. Rumpke has also been an assistant football coach at Lexington Catholic High School for the last 25 years.

Also AARP offers a variety of free online events and classes designed for learning, self-improvement and fun. There is a calendar and you can click on any day to see what is offered such as movies, talks with authors, exercise classes, games to play. For example, in February 2021, the Guide to Virtual Events included: a lecture on "A History of the Fast Food Industry"; author James Patterson speaking about his book *Walk in My Combat Boots;* a documentary about Aretha Franklin's gospel album *Amazing Grace;* dancing to Motown Magic, etc. The Guide includes a place to register for events you wish to join.
