ABOUT THE SPEAKER/TOPIC

F. Douglas Scutchfield is the inaugural Peter P. Bosomworth Professor of Health Services Research and Policy at UK. Dr. Scutchfield received his BS degree with distinction at Eastern Kentucky University and his MD degree from UK. He also received honorary doctorates from EKU and Pikeville College.

Dr. Scutchfield has held academic positions at the University of Alabama, San Diego State University and UK, among others. He founded the Graduate School of Public Health at San Diego State University and the School of Public Health at UK. He has received numerous honors, including the Distinguished Service Award of the American College of Preventive Medicine and the Distinguished Service Award of the American Medical Association, the highest honor they award to a physician. He served as the Editor of the American Journal of Preventive Medicine and is the author of numerous other texts, book chapters and refereed journal articles. He resides in Lexington Kentucky, with his wife Phyllis.

UK MEN'S BASKETBALL TICKET AVAILABILITY FOR FACULTY/STAFF

For those who don't have season tickets and wish to attend a game, you may be able to obtain tickets from the Athletic Dept. The UK Staff Senate, in conjunction with UK Athlet-

ics, is pleased to offer full-time UK faculty and staff the opportunity to purchase tickets to UK Men's Basketball home games prior to the tickets being released for sale to the general public. Retirees have the same benefits as full-time faculty/staff in this regard.

Following each UK student ticket distribution for men's basketball games, full-time UK faculty and staff will have the opportunity to purchase unclaimed student tickets if available. Tickets will be available noon-4:00 p.m. on that day only and may be purchased at the UK Ticket Office in the Joe Craft Center. No phone orders will be accepted and ticket limits may apply based on availability. Each full-time faculty/staff member will need to present a valid UK ID (Blue Faculty/Staff ID card only; no departmental IDs will be accepted.) Note: if the students sell out of their ticket allotment, there will be NO faculty/staff tickets available to sell.

UK RESEARCH STUDY: PARTICIPANTS NEEDED

Researchers at the University of Kentucky are examining how vitamin D status and seven consecutive days of aerobic training are related to muscle function. Research procedures will take place on the UK campus and volunteers who complete study procedures will be compensated for their time. You may be eligible if you are between 30 and 75 years of age, have normal or controlled blood pressure, do not have any diseases or movement disorders that would prevent you from performing treadmill exercise, are not obese, have not been involved in a scheduled weight lifting or aerobic training program within the past 3 months, and do not engage in more than one hour per week of vigorous activity (large amount of effort with rapid breathing).
