# ABOUT THE SPEAKER Eli Capilouto, President of University of Kentucky



Dr. Eli Capilouto became the 12th President of the University of Kentucky July 1, 2011. Under his leadership, the Commonwealth's flagship and land grant research university has grown from \$2.7 billion to nearly \$4.5 billion in total operations and has gained significant momentum in fulfilling its multi-faceted mission of teaching, research, service, and health care.

President Capilouto has led a nearly 10-year, \$2.8 billion transformation of the campus,

aimed at enriching the living-learning experience of UK's students; ensuring their success; strengthening the University's research infrastructure; and expanding UK HealthCare's capacity to teach, heal and serve. He is dedicated to solving Kentucky's most intractable health and economic challenges. Through partnerships with the private sector, increased philanthropy, and effective financial management, UK is self-financing most of this aggressive infrastructure development.

Under his leadership, the priorities outlined in the Strategic Plan and the innovation of the campus has resulted in historic student success, a dynamic research enterprise, a sophisticated health care operation serving more patients with increasingly complex needs, and continued service to the people of Kentucky. The progress on the campus is resulting in a high-quality workforce and improved wellbeing for the Commonwealth that UK has served for more than 150 years.

A native of Montgomery, Alabama, Dr. Capilouto previously served as provost of the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) and dean of the UAB School of Public Health -- a period of remarkable growth and transformation at one of the leading academic and health sciences institutions in the South. Dr. Capilouto holds several undergraduate and graduate degrees from schools within the University of Alabama system, a Doctorate of Dental Medicine from UAB and a Doctorate in Health Policy and Management from Harvard University. He and his wife, Dr. Mary Lynne Capilouto (D.M.D.), former Dean of the UAB School of Dentistry, have one daughter.

Of course, some specifics are in this newsletter, but as our meeting gets closer, we will offer more information about Spindletop, as some new members may not be familiar with the UK-owned facility on Iron Works Pike near the KY Horse Park, now officially named The Club at UK's Spindletop Hall. Parking is convenient and free.

Your support during the pandemic is especially appreciated and has been essential for us to maintain a relatively solid financial footing. Please consider responding in a timely manner to the invitations to renew your membership and to attend the September 14 lunch. We are working on a plan to help members needing transportation to Spindletop.

I know you will be impressed with our future 2021-22 luncheon speakers who will follow UK's President.

There is one area of interest where your AEF board has been especially helpful. The UK IT office has proposed some form of restriction on retirees' use of UK email addresses. A few weeks ago, the AEF board had a Zoom meeting with the principal UK IT person involved. He listened attentively to our concerns, and we believe any proposed changes have been put on hold for now.

Have a great remainder of the summer. Looking forward to seeing you on September 14 at Spindletop.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT** James Chapman, UKAEF Treasurer

I am pleased to tell you that due to the work of those who have helped us meet our income goals, the loyalty of our members, and the generosity of our donors, UKAEF has made it financially through this COVID year.

Our budget is made up of three components: Luncheons, Endowment Contributions, and Operating Expenses. Here is the way 2020-21 went.

**Luncheons**: Since we hosted no luncheons, we did not have any income or expenses in that area.

**Endowment Contributions**: We anticipated that due to our unusual situation, contributions might be down—but you proved us wrong. We projected \$5,000, but you came through with our third highest amount in the last 16 years--\$6,035. Thank you very much. All those funds go to the endowment.

**Operating Expenses**: Operating Expenses are supported by UKAEF Members paying dues. They usually run around \$3600, with about half going to an administrative person to handle typing, mailing, keeping records, etc. for the efficient operation of the Association. This year we thought membership would be down, and we planned to take funds from the \$3600 we carry forward for emergencies each year (this looked like a good candidate for an emergency year!). However, you came through for the Association again. We projected membership would be down to 150 rather than the 200 we usually project (\$3000 vs. \$4000), but in the end 183 members paid their dues. That gave the Association \$3660 with which to work and that pretty much covered the expenses of around \$3850. We had some minor extra costs for mailings, postage, and the person who helps with that. Things worked out surprisingly well this year.

For next year we hope to have all our 200 members back and match our \$6000 that was so generously given for the Fellowship Endowment. We plan on having four lunches and hope to average 60 people at the luncheons—although we hope to have more as we begin meeting at Spindletop. On the expense side, the Endowment money goes to the Endowment Fund, the luncheon payments go to pay for the meals, and the membership dues will pay for the Operating Expenses. This year we plan to keep the cost of luncheons at \$25. The actual cost will be a little more per meal; but to keep the price stable in this transition year and encourage attendance, the Association will cover the difference from the fund balance. Again, thank you for your support.

## RETIREE OPTIONS WITH UK RETIREMENT PLANS

What retirees decide to do with their retirement savings through UK retirement plans is truly an individual decision based upon their needs and preferences.

The plans are designed so that a retiree does not have to move her/his funds or make any changes just because they have retired. Their money is safe with their chosen vendor(s), earning interest and taking advantage of the low fees that come with being part of a large employer's plan. UK is a significant client to its vendors in terms of assets (retirement savings invested through them) since UK is a flagship employer of choice in the Commonwealth.

TIAA and Fidelity are the chosen vendors through a committee purchasing process, earning the UK account, and each has a strong presence in higher education and health care. Both vendors have equal participation by active employees and retirees, and both are considered excellent vendors in the retirement plan record-keeping space. They offer value-added services and user-friendly technology platforms. From my perspective in my role over benefits, I am impressed with the attention and service we receive from both vendors – they are very responsive to us. I consider them as partners in helping us help our UK community.

Both vendors provide consultation services by salaried staff who are not commission-driven in the services they provide. These services help employees and retirees with their needs for saving, investing, and the use of their retirement funds to achieve their retirement income planning and goals. Both vendors offer a plethora of educational information and tools for their participants.

Employees and retirees have the option to hire an outside Registered Investment Advisor (RIA). In this case, it is an individual choice to pay an additional fee for the service these advisors provide. A reason for hiring an RIA could include one's desire to have an individual expert completely manage their investments for them and possibly also receive more individualized attention. An RIA can manage the investments for the individual within the investment options provided by UK, based on that individual's goals.

Some retirees move their retirement funds to an individual retirement account (IRA). Again, this is an individual decision, and it may involve the use of an RIA. One should weigh the pros (maybe more flexibility) and cons (maybe higher fees) and make an individual decision to move retirement funds to an IRA.

There is not a one-size-fits-all solution. The good news is what UK provides is a viable solution for most UK Retirement Plan participants. A minority of its participants choose to hire an RIA.

We stand ready to assist our retirees with benefits and services that can help them thrive.

# TURNING POINT TRUST: NEW EFFORT BY INT'L BOOK PROJECT

The International Book Project (IBP) is a registered 501 (3) not-for-profit organization, founded by Harriet Van Meter in 1966. IBP's international partners' commitment to strengthening their communities through education motivates IBP to continue tailoring shipments of educational materials as requested. In addition to their international work of shipping books, IBP strives to increase access to books in the United States at prisons, food banks, Title I schools and other non-profits. The International Book Project (IBP) has always believed that books change lives.

A new IBP program, Turning Point Trust, has the goal to put books into the hands of children in Kenya. Turning Point Trust operates their own school, Fountains of Hope, with 133 students enrolled in Kenya. The school has no on-site library to give their students an opportunity to improve their literacy skills and read for fun. International Book Project curates shipments of books to Fountains of Hope School and needs help paying the postage. To send one small box of books to Kenya through the mail is \$150.00. By sending a pallet with far more books, that cost is lowered to \$50.00/box. Similar worthy partners request help from IBP regularly—more requests than they have money to support. If you wish to help IBP with a monetary donation to send books to those in need (suggestion of \$25.00), send your gift to Int'l Book Project, 1440 Delaware Ave, Lexington KY 40505.
