ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Lawrence Weathers was sworn in as Chief of Police on March 4, 2018. Weathers and his nine siblings grew up in Lexington's Bluegrass Aspendale and Hollow Creek neighborhoods. He holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Kentucky and earned a Master's in criminal justice from Eastern Kentucky University. Chief Weathers was hired by the Lexington Police Department in 1989. Over the succeeding 27 years he began

his career working as a Patrol officer assigned to the D.A.R.E. program, and a narcotics detective. When promoted to Sergeant he was a supervisor in every bureau within the Lexington Police Department. After returning to the Narcotics Enforcement as a Lieutenant he became the commanding supervisor of the Internal Affairs Section, where he was responsible for investigating, tracking, and managing complaints against department officers. Weathers was then promoted to the rank of Commander and assigned to the Bureau of Patrol. In March 2011 Commander Weathers was reassigned to the Training Section. With his appointment to Assistant Chief in 2014, Weathers led the Bureau of Special Operations until his retirement from Lexington Police in 2016. In July 2016 Weathers was selected as the Director of Law Enforcement for Fayette County Public Schools. As the Director of Law Enforcement, he was responsible for the safety and security of more than 40,000 students, staff, and visitors, as well as dozens of school district properties. When announcing his return to the police department in 2018 as Chief of Police, Mayor Gray noted Weathers' commitment to community policing and how well respected he is throughout Lexington.

F. Douglas Scutchfield MD - Immediate Past President of UK AEF, died on May 23, 2022, at the age of 80. "Doug" or "Scutch" was a true legend in the world of Public Health and founded the UK College of Public Health in 1997. In addition, he authored more than 200 publications, oversaw grants, and taught many students emphasizing the importance of Public Health. Scutch received many accolades and awards for his numerous accomplishments. UK AEF misses his contributions and wisdom. His family suggested memorial contributions to Eastern Kentucky University Scutchfield Endowment Scholarship Fund, UK College of Public Health, or University of Kentucky Opera Department.

Mary Witt - We give special thanks to **Mary Witt** for her many years of service as **AEF newsletter editor**. In addition to her editing skills, her contributions and leadership made AEF a better and more viable organization.

Dr. James Chapman's years of high-level leadership at this and other universities equipped him to become **AEF's treasurer** at a challenging time. Thanks, Jim, for so many years of putting your financial skill to work for the betterment of AEF.

TREASURER'S REPORT

James Chapman, UKAEF Treasurer

Our budget consists of three components: Luncheons, Endowment Contributions, and Operation Expenses with the primary source of income from membership dues and endowment contributions. The following is for 7/1/2021-6/30/22 as of July 1, 2022:

Luncheons: The luncheon held in person on 4/12/22 brought in \$825 and cost \$1284 for a loss of \$459. The 2022-23 budget for luncheons is \$5000.

Endowment Contributions: We projected \$6000 and again our membership came through with \$7062. All these funds go to the endowment for annual fellowship awards to graduate or professional students. The 2022-23 budget for endowment is for \$6500. Thank you for your generosity in 2021-22 and hopefully we will continue to exceed the budget!

Operating Expenses: Membership Dues collected during 2021-22 were \$4020 and projected for the 2022-23 budget to be \$4995. The administrative consultant cost \$2050 in 2021-22 and is projected to be \$2000 for 2022-23. For the year, we ran over postage by \$305 (but we have \$279 in the separate postage account), our post office box jumped by \$72, Printing and Reproduction ran over by \$299, and the administrative costs were \$350 more than budgeted. Those overages total \$1025 but are offset by a \$36 surplus in Supplies and \$345 we set aside as a contingency. All that nets to \$645 loss.

Overall: We started out with a \$3410 fund balance, lost \$459 on the lunches, \$645 on the operating expenses, and have a balance to carryforward of \$2300.

2022-23 New Budget: Our proposed new budget will include an additional \$5 per person for dues. That should keep us solvent next year if we can control the luncheon costs. We were over by around \$1000 in expenses this year, and the \$5 extra in dues gives us \$1000 (if we have two hundred members). The result is that we have only a cushion of around \$500 in the expenses. The key to stability is to increase the membership beyond 200 members.
