Between 1989 and 1999, the representation of minority men among the full professor ranks increased by $3.5 \%$, but the proportion of minority women at that rank declined by $3.2 \%$.

Conversely, in the same period, the rate of increase of women of color at the Assoc. Professor rank was 4 times greater than that of men of color ( $+9.1 \%-$ vs.- $2.2 \%$ ). At the rank of Asst. Professor, the proportion of men of color increased more rapidly than that of women of color ( $9.7 \%$-vs.- $6.6 \%$ ).
