Rationale for Proposal: The name change would more accurately reflect the content within the curriculum. All options either cover management in general or focus on the management of a particular aspect of business. In addition, the curriculum of this program has evolved to meet the needs of local students. In order to continue to meet the needs of local students and the needs of business in this area, LCC must maintain its particular set of requirements. The prefix on all current course numbers should be changed to reflect the changed focus of the program (MGT for management courses and MKT for marketing courses) and to resolve course content conflicts with existing KCTCS courses. KCTCS courses will transfer into this program and advisors will work with transfer students to ensure equivalencies.

MGT and MKT are commonly used prefixes for management and marketing courses at colleges. In addition, Dan Lockhart, Assistant Dean of the UK Gatton College of Business, has confirmed that LCC's use of the same prefixes would not be a problem.
