Grade Descriptions

Proposed definitions for grades assigned in Agricultural Economics courses:

- Grade A Represents exceptionally high achievement as a result of aptitude, effort, and intellectual initiative.
- Grade B Represents greater than satisfactory achievement as a result of ability and effort.
- Grade C A grade of C represents satisfactory achievement of knowledge/performance skills in the subject matter to pursue competently the next level of course work or to utilize effectively the subject matter in relevant societal roles.
- Grade D A grade of D indicates unsatisfactory achievement of knowledge/performance in required courses within the major and will not give credit for graduation. The grade indicates the student is not competent to pursue the next level of course work or to utilize effectively the subject matter in relevant societal roles. For other elective departmental courses, a grade of D indicates minimal acceptable achievement of knowledge/performance skills.
- Grade E Unsatisfactory performance and indicates failure in the course.
