RE: Minor Course/Program Change Item #9

The purpose of this memo is to seek approval for a minor course change:

- o Change BA 610 (Global Business Management) to MGT 610 (Global Management)

This course was initially developed with the College-wide 'BA' prefix to enable faculty in a variety of B&E departments to teach the course. However, with increasing specialization within the field of business administration, the course has been (9+ years) and will be taught exclusively by Management faculty. Furthermore, this prefix change reflects the organizational/structural reality that the MBA Program is governed by the *School of Management* – the academic unit within the College comprised of the areas of Management, Marketing, Finance, and Decision Science – not, more broadly, *business and economics*, *business administration*, or the College itself.

Additionally, a change in the course prefix necessitates a corresponding, yet minor change in the MBA Program itself. In particular, BA 610 is currently a required MBA core course. So, a change in the course prefix would mean that MGT 610 should be officially designated as a MBA core course.
