New Courses

- FAM 763 <u>Seminar in Primary Prevention for Family Science and Human Development</u> (3) Designed to provide students with a background in prevention science with applications in family science and child development. Topics will include primary prevention of mental health problems among families and children, principles of prevention, prevention research design, ethical issues, and national agendas in primary prevention research. Prereg: Admission to a doctoral program in the social or behavioral sciences
- FAM 796 <u>Sponsored Research Development in Family Science and Human Development</u> (2) Application of content knowledge and research skills to the proposal development process. Students will work in teams to respond to state and federal research program announcements. May be repeated to 6 credits. Prereq: Admission to the doctoral program in family studies is required.

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
