Depending on the student's area of interest and subject to the advisor's approval, an additional 15 hours of courses at the 200-level or above may be selected from biochemistry, biology, chemistry, physics, statistics, or any agricultural related area other than Animal Sciences

Rationale: As currently presented in the UK Bulletin, some students think they have to take all of the courses listed under the Specialty Support area. The proposed changes will help avoid confusion by students as to what courses are required and what courses are appropriate as controlled electives under the specialty Support area.
