APPLICATION TO DROP A COURSE

- 44 ACC 318 (originally ACC 208) was developed in the early 1990's in response to calls from employers of our graduates to increase the soft skills of our graduates, in particular, computer and communication skills. Increasingly, students entering our program already have substantial computer skills and communication skills are being developed elsewhere on campus and by incorporating oral and written requirements into other courses in the accounting curriculum.
