## Change in Master's Degree Program - Physician Assistant Studies

Experience with the first class of Masters students in requiring an oral defense has led the faculty to the conclusion that the logistics of requiring an oral defense for every student given the total of three overlapping classes of students (165 students) is unworkable in the long run and represents an exorbitant demand on limited faculty resources.

The PAS faculty proposes that instead of requiring all students to complete an oral defense on a research topic, students be required to complete a comprehensive written exam shortly before graduation. This exam will cover the entire curriculum and all students will take the same exam.

We would like to continue to have the students complete a project for their degree: however, the PAS faculty proposes that instead of requiring all students to complete an oral defense on a research topic, students be required to complete a comprehensive written exam shortly before graduation. This exam will cover the entire curriculum, and all students will take the same exam.

The PAS faculty would like for the requested change to apply to the class that is scheduled to graduate in August 2003. Because our currently registered students (classes of 2003. 2004. 2005) entered the program under the oral exam required. the program would offer them the choice of either an oral or a written exam. The offer would be made non-coercive manner. The written final exam would be the only option available to the class of 2006 (entering January 2004). and subsequent classes.

The College of Health Sciences recommends for your approval the following change in the Physician Assistant Studies (PAS) Master's Degree program:

## Plan B requirements:

**Proposed Changes:** The Physician Assistant Studies Division requests a change in the requirement that all students complete an oral defense to a requirement that students complete a comprehensive written examination.

**Rationale:** Experience with the first class of master's students in requiring an oral defense has led the faculty to the conclusion that the logistics of requiring an oral defense for every student given the total of 3 overlapping classes of students (165 students) is unworkable in the long run and represents an exorbitant demand on limited faculty resources. The PAS faculty proposes that, instead of requiring all students to complete an oral defense on a research topic, students be required to complete a comprehensive written exam shortly before graduation. This exam will cover the entire curriculum, and all students will take the same exam.

The PAS faculty would like for the requested change to apply to the first class that is scheduled to graduate in August 2003. Because our currently registered students (Classes of 2003, 2004, 2005) entered the program under the oral exam requirement, the program would offer them the choice of either an oral or a written exam. The offer would be made in a non-coercive manner. The written final exam would be the only option available to the Class of 2006 (entering January 2004), and subsequent classes.
