Experience with the first class of Masters students in requiring an oral defense has led the faculty to the conclusion that the logistics of requiring an oral defense for every student given the total of three overlapping classes of students (165 students) is unworkable in the long run and represents an exorbitant demand on limited faculty resources.

The PAS faculty proposes that instead of requiring all students to complete an oral defense on a research topic, students be required to complete a comprehensive written exam shortly before graduation. This exam will cover the entire curriculum and all students will take the same exam.
