

District Qualifying Shows

In order to participate at the state 4-H Horse Show, members must show and qualify in their selected classes at their District Qualifying Horse Show. It is strongly recommended that District Management Teams have in addition to their show date, a rain date to provide 4-H members the opportunity to qualify for the State Horse Show.

If circumstances (such as but not limited to heavy rain, lightning, power failure, etc.) beyond the control of the District Show Committee arise and the committee and Horse Show judge make the decision that a class or classes must be cancelled due to unsafe conditions, the 4-H members who are entered in those classes and present at the show (and **only** those 4-H members), will be allowed to show at the State Horse Show. This exception will apply only to those classes that were cancelled.

If a situation arises during a class that in the opinion of the Show Committee and Horse Show judge results in unsafe conditions and the remainder of the class is cancelled, those 4-H members which were unable to compete at the District show will be allowed to participate at the State Horse Show.

However, if the Show Committee and the horse Show judge determine that the class can be safely held, their decision will be final.

A report must be sent to the State Horse Extension Specialist the next business day following the show including date of show:

- a detailed description of circumstances for cancellation
- all entries involved
- all committee members involved in the decision (name and contact information)
- horse show judge and contact information
