The regular meeting of the Midway City Council was called to order by Mayor Grayson Vandegrift and the following Council Members were present: Kaye Nita Gallagher, Sara Hicks, John Holloway, Logan Nance, Bruce Southworth, and Stacy Thurman. Attorney Phil Moloney as present.

Motion was made by Council Member Hicks and seconded by Council Member Nance to approve the December 2, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes. Motion carried 5-0. Council Member Gallagher abstained from the vote.

Motion was made by Council Member Hicks and seconded by Council Member Thurman to approve the December 9, 2019 Special Meeting Minutes. All in favor; Motion carried 6-0

New Business

Matt Carter with Vision Engineering, a representative for White Dog Trading and Storage, LLC, was present to discuss an encroachment permit. Council Member Southworth made a motion to approve the permit; Council Member Nance seconded the motion; All in favor; Motion carried 6-0

Bob Baney was present to discuss the 2020 Frozen Rails Event Permit. Council Member Nance made a motion to approve the permit; Council Member Thurman seconded the motion; All in favor; Motion carried 6-0

Riley Marshall and Zack Bevin were present to discuss the 2020 Iron Horse Event and answer questions. There will be discussion and a vote at the January 6th meeting.

Mayor Vandegrift presented information to the City Council about the current fiscal year budget and the need to amend certain items in the budget due to the following:

- 1. The street paving project
- 2. Reshaping Sewer Project to CIPP at the beginning of Fiscal Year 2020/2021
- 3. The Higgins Line loan being paid off early
- 4. The need for a new tractor/loader/backhoe

Council Member Hicks made a motion to proceed with the budget amendment; Council Member Southworth seconded the motion; All in favor; Motion carried. There will be a first reading of the Budget Amendment at the January 6th Council Meeting.

First Reading of Ordinance 2019-014


Half Marathon Route



CITY OF MIDWAY, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 014

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 153 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATED TO CODE ENFORCEMENT AND ESTABLISHING A CODE ENFORCEMENT BOARD PURSUANT TO KRS 65.8801 to KRS 65.8839; ESTABLISHING THE TERMS, ORGANIZATION, POWERS AND JURISDICTION OF THE **BOARD**: **ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES** FOR **ENFORCEMENT** PROCEEDINGS, ISSUANCE OF NOTICES OF VIOLATIONS, CITATIONS, CONTESTING A CITATION, HEARINGS, NOTICE, FINAL ORDERS AND APPPEALS; AUTHORIZING HEARING OFFICERS TO CONDUCT HEARINGS ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD; ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR ABATEMENT, LIENS AND FINES, LIENHOLDER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM, LIEN PRIORITY, DUE PROCESS AND RIGHT OF ENTRY, STOP WORK ORDERS, ADMININSTRATIVE SEARCH WARRANTS; AND ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE FOR PENALTIES APPLICABLE TO VIOALTION OF ORDINANCES SUBJECT TO ENFORCEMENT BY THE BOARD.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of KRS 65.8801 to 65.8840 to protect, promote, and improve the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens residing within the City by authorizing the creation of an administrative board with the authority to issue remedial orders and impose fines in order to provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive method of ensuring compliance with ordinances in force within the City; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Midway, Kentucky to utilize the authority granted in KRS 65.8801 to 65.8839 by creating a City of Midway Code Enforcement Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Midway as follows:

§153.01 Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (a) "Abatement Costs" means a city's necessary and reasonable costs for and associated with clearing, preventing unauthorized entry to, or demolishing all or a portion of a structure or Premises, or taking any other action with regard to a structure or Premises necessary to remedy a violation and to maintain and preserve the public health, safety and welfare in accordance with any city ordinance.
- (b) "Code Enforcement Board" means an administrative body created and acting under the authority of the Local Government Code Enforcement Board Act, KRS 65.8801 to 65.8839.

OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO NUISANCE AND BLIGHTED AND DETERIORATED PROPERTIES AND REPEALING SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES 92.32 - 92.35 & ENACTING NEW §§92.32-92.35 IN THEIR PLACE & REPEALING §152.03

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Midway to protect, promote, safeguard and improve the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens residing within the City by prohibiting, eliminating and remediating nuisances and blighted and deteriorated properties and ensuring compliance of and/or in enforcing its ordinances to accomplish the same, including, establishing of a Code Enforcement Board with the authority to issue remedial orders and impose fines in order to provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive method of ensuring compliance with ordinances in force within the City; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Midway, Kentucky to amend and update its ordinances from time to time to promote the intent underlying such ordinances for ensuring compliance with and/or enforcement of its ordinances;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Midway, Kentucky that Ordinances \S 92.21-92.26; 92.28-92.47; 152.01-152.04 and 152.07 and 152.09 are amended, Ordinance \S 92.32 – 35 and 152.03 are repealed, and new \S 92.32-92.35 enacted as follows:

NUISANCES

§ 92.21 WEEDS, GRASS AND RUBBISH.

- (A) It shall be unlawful for the owner, occupant or person having control or management of any land within the city to permit a public nuisance, health hazard or source of filth to develop thereon, especially through the accumulation of rubbish or excessive growth thereon of weeds or grass.
- (B) Whenever such a situation is discovered, a city police officer, safety officer, citation officer, other public law or code enforcement officer or Mayor or her or his designee shall give ten (10) days' written notice to remedy the situation. The notice of violation shall be mailed to the last known address of the owner of the property, as it appears on the current tax assessment roll. Any occupant or person having control or management of the property who also so offends shall likewise be given notice by a notice either posted upon the premises, personally served or mailed to the address of the property.
- (C) Upon the failure of the owner, occupant or person having control or management of the property to remedy the violation within the prescribed time following the date of the
