At Philosophy Camp, students will work together to think carefully about classic philosophical readings by engaging in counselor led reading groups and discussions. Students will write reflections every day in order to articulate their ideas and, with the help of the counseling staff, will revise their entries in an effort to develop well-formed arguments.

Cost of Attendance
