University of Kentucky Police Department (UKPD)

- Police Officers (64)
- Civilian-Administrative (17)
- Dispatch (12)
- Security (98)
- Total Employees (191)



UKPD

- 22 weeks of police academy training
- 16 weeks of training at UKPD
- 40 hours of annual in-service training
- Nine graduates of the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) National Academy
- All officers equipped with body cameras




Bluegrass and Central Kentucky Unified Police Protection System (BACKUPPS)

- Formed by an inter-jurisdictional agreement under KRS 65.240
- One of the original 26 agencies and only university at the time
- Allows jurisdictional authority for sharing of personnel and resources
- Current membership (63 agencies)

Campus Security Project

- Approved by the Board at its June 2012 meeting
- Estimated scope of \$4,800,000
- Project completion time of 36 months
- Four components



Component Parts

- Implement a video management system and install cameras
- Incorporate access control system into buildings
- Consolidate identification (ID) badge operations
- Implement early warning notification system



Benefits

- Quick resolution to recent crimes
- Increased awareness to enhance safety
- Broader coverage for emergency notifications
- Assists facilities management
- Develops a campus security standard for all new buildings
- "One card" concept




Campus Security Project (Current Status)

- 86 buildings now on access control
 - Original project was 25
- Over 80,000 cards issued since transition to "one card" concept
- Maxwell Street corridor project scheduled to begin next month
 - Cameras & emergency phones

 Consolidated campus and UK HealthCare ID operations developing the "one card"









Exterior Notification













Crisis Management and Preparedness Responsibilities

- Emergency action plans-campus buildings
- Emergency operation plans for large events
- CLERY/Minger Act compliance and reporting
- Business continuity planning
- Hazard mitigation plan & Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) projects
- UK Alert and emergency communications
- Emergency Operations Center
- Emergency response training and exercises



UK Alert

- The University operates an emergency message notification system for the purpose of delivering subscription based emergency messages to the campus community
- Triggered by an event that is <u>currently</u> occurring on campus or is considered an <u>immediate</u> threat to campus safety



UK Alert Enrollment

- 59,665 currently enrolled
- All University students, staff, and faculty are automatically registered into email notification with their official University email address (uky.edu)
- Text messaging & voice call are optional
- 58% or 34,407 selected the optional registration for text message notification.



Modes of Delivery

- Campus voice over internet protocol (VOIP) (6,131)
- Fire integration panels (17)
 - Located in all new construction & some recently renovated buildings
- Twitter (85,000)
- Facebook (400,000)
- Campus web page (uky.edu)
- Blue emergency phone towers (exterior notification)
 - 90% coverage of campus



Future Goals

- Virtual patrol of campus
- Implementation of desktop notification software
- Live streaming in-car and body cameras for officers
- Holster and body armor alerts
- Dynamic dispatching utilizing global positioning system (GPS) technology
- Continued focus on improving preparedness for known and no-notice events

Campus Wide Radio Project

- Prior Public Safety radio system 23 years old
- Not Compliant with P25 standards
- New radio system upgrade will unite all campus radio systems into a single system
- Implementation underway (35% complete)
- Projected completion date of January 2019
- Enables inter-communication with Lexington Public Safety radio system
- Future coverage expansion to include partnerships with Madison and Scott Counties
