


### **Budget Development Principles**

## University of Kentucky Consolidated Operating Budget



#### **Background:**

- The recommended consolidated operating budget is balanced
- Sets expenditure authority by area, college, and department
- Includes all components of the University (e.g., academic enterprise, hospital system, clinical patient care, research, philanthropy, athletics)
- Current Funds only using modified accrual basis of accounting






# Operating Revenues Percent Change by Fund Source FY 2007-08 to FY 2017-18






## Fiscal Health Actual Financial Results









Non-Resident Undergraduate Fall 2016 Tuition and Fee Rates







## **Tuition and Mandatory Fee Parameters Academic Year 2017-18**


- Instate undergraduate students: 4% increase ceiling
- Out-of-state undergraduate students: Average net tuition and fee revenue should equal or exceed 100% of direct instructional and student services costs per student
- Graduate and Professional students: tuition and mandatory fees are to be market competitive




# University of Kentucky Centrally Funded Student Financial Aid and Student Enrollment


## Fall 2010 Entering Freshmen (full-time resident) Cohort





- 3,276 KY residents enrolled as first-time freshmen in Fall 2010
- 2,107 students graduated by 2016 (64%)
- 49% of graduates had no student loans
- The average debt of graduates with loans was \$30,970
- UK's federal student loan default rate is 4.4%; nationally, the default rate for public institutions is 11.3%
