2006-07 BUDGET REVISIONS

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the Board of Trustees authorize and approve the following revisions to the 2006-07 budget. The budget revisions outlined below will increase the University of Kentucky's total budget by \$12,868,700 – from \$1,894,473,200 to \$1,907,341,900.

<u>Comments</u> – Per Executive Order 2006-1016, the Arboretum and the Pilot Project Music/Arts Extension Agent Employment each receive \$50,000 in state appropriated funds in FY 2007 and FY 2008 to support program expenses.

Income from Gifts, Grants, and Contracts increased \$250,000 for the Council on Postsecondary Education's "Strategy for Statewide Engineering Education in Kentucky." The purpose of this program - - involving the University of Kentucky, the University of Louisville, Western Kentucky University, and Murray State University – is to deliver joint baccalaureate degree programs in civil, mechanical, and electrical engineering across the state in order to increase the number of engineers in Kentucky.

Departmental Sales and Services income increased \$155,500 due to reimbursement from Vanderbilt Law School and John Marshall Law School for salary expenses associated with temporary assignments.

Due to ownership rights, the proceeds from the sale of the "right of way" on Newtown Pike were recorded in Departmental Sales and Services (\$300,000) and Transfers (\$525,000). These funds will be used by the College of Agriculture to support special projects associated with the equine initiative.

Prior-year fund balances of \$550,000 will be budgeted for infrastructure improvements at the Coldstream Research Campus.

The University Hospital anticipates earning an additional \$10 million as a result of increased patient activity and volume. This income will be used for increased personnel costs and to support two additional nursing locations. In addition, the increased activity has led to additional supply costs.

3. <u>Comments</u> – UK Libraries received \$13,200 in gifts and endowment income to support student workers and purchase materials for processing the Mr. Logan P. English collection located in the Libraries' Special Collections and Digital Programs.

Student Aid increased \$975,000 from participation in two new federally funded programs for Pell-eligible undergraduate students pursuant to the Higher Education Reconciliation Act of 2005. This increase funded: (1) Academic Competitiveness Grants (ACG) of \$550,000 to eligible freshmen and sophomores whose high school work, ACT/SAT, and GPA met prescribed standards, and (2) National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent (SMART) Grants of \$425,000 to eligible junior and seniors whose GPA and major field of study met prescribed criteria.
