PROPOSED 2009-10 ROOM AND BOARD RATES

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees adopt the attached 2009-10 room and board rates.

<u>Background</u>: The proposed housing rates reflect an average increase of five percent for 2009-10. The increase is necessary to generate sufficient revenue to cover fixed cost increases and a reduction in available beds in 2009-2010. The university will have fewer beds online as it implements the multi-phase housing plan presented to the Finance Committee of the Board of Trustees at its December 2008 meeting. Phase I replaces housing currently on the Cooperstown site with approximately 1,200 new beds expected to be available by Fall 2010. The overall project to replace or renovate the majority of the current housing inventory is expected to continue for the next 20 years.

The proposed dining rates include a three percent increase for the minimum plan. The proposed resident tuition, mandatory fees, and housing and dining rates for an incoming freshman total \$14,212 for the fall and spring semesters, a 4.7 percent increase over the prior year.

Dining (per semester effective Fall 2009)

Dining Services will offer four dining plans during 2009-10. All students living in residence halls are required to purchase a dining plan. Three plans provide five to 21 meals per week. In response to student feedback, a 'block' plan also will be available. The block plan includes 130 meals which can be used any time during the semester. Weekly and block plan meals are provided at Commons Market and Blazer Café ("unlimited choices" buffets) and at K-Lair and Ovid's Café (combo meals).

Each dining plan also includes 300 'Flex Dollars'. Flex dollars can be used at any of Dining Services' 22 locations to purchase a' la carte items. Up to 100 flex dollars may be carried over from the fall to spring semester.
