<u>Bios for Board of Directors</u> University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation, Inc.

<u>David R. Cobb</u>: Mr. Cobb is the Vice President of Corporate Development at Armstrong Coal Company. He has provided mining engineering services for hundreds of coal mine development and operating properties throughout Kentucky and in Indiana, Illinois, Tennessee, Alabama, Wyoming and other coal producing states as well as Columbia and Venezuela in South America. He holds a B.S. in Civil Engineering with the Mining Option from the University of Kentucky and is a licensed Professional Engineer in Kentucky, Indiana, and Illinois.
