DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the Board of Trustees approve a plan for fiscal year 2005-2006 authorizing routine disposition of personal property having a value of less than \$10,000 per item to include equipment and machinery, vehicles, library books and materials, livestock and recyclable materials, and the methods of disposal as listed on Attachment I, .

<u>Background</u>: Kentucky Revised Statute 164A.575 requires that the Board of Trustees approve disposition of equipment and other property. Administrative Regulation II-1.3-3, approved by the Board of Trustees on August 16, 1994 establishes the policies and procedures including required approvals for the disposition of personal property. This plan will provide an efficient and timely process for the disposition of property having a value of less than \$10,000 in accordance with Administrative Regulation II-1.3-3. Dispositions of personal property having a value greater than \$10,000 will be approved by the Board of Trustees on a case by case basis.

Included in the 2005-06 disposition plan is the allowable transfer of surplus equipment to governmental units in support of specific established programs, such as the Lexington-Urban County Government's Dell TechKnow Program.

ATTACHMENT I

ANTICIPATED DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY 2005-2006

A. Equipment and Machinery

Method of Disposal Public Auction Internet Auction Sealed Bid Fixed Price Retail Outlet Transfers to Other State Agencies or Governmental Units, Educational Institutions, or not-for-profit organizations <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Equipment and machinery surplus to the needs of the University due to depreciation, obsolescence, program changes or termination.

B. Vehicles

Method of Disposal Public Auction Fixed Price Internet Auction <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Vehicles of excessive age and/or mileage or in need of major repairs.

C. Library Books and Materials

Method of Disposal Public Auction Sealed Bid Fixed Price <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Library books and materials that are obsolete or outdated.

D. Livestock

Method of Disposal Public Auction Sealed Bid Fixed Price <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Livestock surplus to the needs of the College of Agriculture or otherwise unsuitable for use (completion of research projects, carcass data requirements, normal culling of herds).

E. Recyclable Materials

Method of Disposal Price Contracts Fixed Price Reason for Disposal

To comply with regulations for proper and timely disposition of waste products and recyclable materials (as directed by the Office of Environmental Health and Safety).
