## UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY REQUEST FOR DISPOSITION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

**Description** One Wheelchair Aerobic Fitness Trainer

Reason for Disposition

Dr. David Gater, Assistant Professor in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, is the exclusive user of the equipment. Dr. Gater has accepted a position with the University of Michigan where he will continue his research in spinal cord injury care. Dr. Gater has stated, and Associate Vice President for Research and Graduate Studies and the Senior Vice President and Chancellor of the Medical Center agree that the prototype Wheelchair Aerobic Fitness Trainer will no longer be used by Dr. Gater's collaborators at the University of Kentucky, but is very instrumental in Dr. Gater continuing his research at the University of Michigan. Therefore, in the interest of the general public, selling the equipment would enable the research to continue and would also avoid loss of value due to further depreciation. A sale price of \$23,335, the original cost less depreciation, has been negotiated with the University of Michigan.

Method of Disposition

Negotiated Sale
