PROPOSED 2002-03 AND 2003-04 TUITION SCHEDULE
Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees (1) adopt a tuition schedule for the 2002-04 biennium consistent with the guidelines of the Council on Postsecondary Education, and (2) establish corresponding part-time and summer school rates.
<u>Background</u> : Under KRS 164.020 (8), the Council on Postsecondary Education is empowered and charged with the responsibility to determine the tuition for attendance at public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth. At the May 21, 2001 meeting of the Council on Postsecondary Education approval was given to tuition setting guidelines to be used by the institutions in setting tuition rates for 2002-2004. Institutions are responsible for setting their own tuition rates consistent with the guidelines approved by the Council.
The proposed tuition rates are in compliance with the Council's guidelines, respond to the public funds distribution objective and relate to the set of benchmark institutions.
The rates proposed for adoption by the Board of Trustees are designed to move various resident rates to or toward the median of the benchmarks, increase most non-resident rates by approximately the same dollar amount as the resident rate increase, meet the public funds distribution objective of the Council, and maintain a reasonable level of increase on an annual basis.
Rates for part-time and summer school students are derived from the semester rate, using the institution's definition of what constitutes a full-time load for each level and program area.
